

Company Expands Broadcast Operations



On October 23rd Electrohome announced the agreement to purchase Sunwapta Boadcasting Limited of Edmonton, Alberta thus expanding substantially Electrohome's involvement in the Canadian broadcasting industry.

President, John Pollock and Dr. G.R. A. Rice, President of Sunwapta stated that the sale was subject to approval by the Canadian Radio and Television Commission (CRTC). Under the terms of the sale, both Sunwapta and C A P Communications, will report to Electrohome Communications Inc. which is a wholly owned subsidiary of Electrohome Limited. Each operation will have its own board of directors and in Sunwapta's case, four of the six board members will be from Alberta.

W. D. (Bill) McGregor, President of CAP Communications, says that both the Ontario and Alberta operations are similar in nature as each have a television station as well as AM and FM radio stations. C A P Communications in Kitchener has CKCO-TV, CKKW-AM and CFCA-FM. Sunwapta operates CFRN-TV, CFRN-AM and CKXM-FM all in Edmonton. Both television stations are members of the CTV network. Mr. McGregor stated that each broadcast operation employs over two hundred people at their respective facilities and that by combining the skills of each operation, programming will be enhanced and additional development opportunities will be provided for each station's personnel.

Dr. Rice, who started the Sunwapta operation back in 1934 with a small AM



station, feels the agreement is fortunate because C A P Communications holds similar philosophies to those of Sunwapta. Each organization cares about the public they serve as well as the people who are employed in each company.

Combined, the Sunwapta and C A P Communications organization will become the third largest entity in the CTV network.

The following is, in part, the application, as published in the Canada Gazette.

shares of Sunwapta Broadcasting Ltd. from 364664 Alberta Ltd. to C A P Communications Limited, licensee of CKKW, CFCA-FM, CKCO-TV Kitchener, CKCO-TV-2 Wiarton, CKCO-TV-3 Oil Springs and CKCO-TV-4 Huntsville, Ontario.

As a result of the transaction, C A P Communications Limited would control 100% of the shares of Sunwapta Broadcasting Ltd.

In accordance with this policy, C A P Communications Limited will be required to demonstrate that significant and unequivocal benefits will accrue to the communities served by the broadcasting undertakings in question, and to the Canadian broadcasting system as a whole, and that approval of the application is in the public interest.

The Commission will wish to explore the impact of this transaction on the organizational structure, strength and performance of the CTV Television Network.

The hearing will take place in Edmonton beginning on February 16th. Naturally we will all be waiting for the CRTC's decision, which will be announced at a later date.

It's believed to be the first program of it's kind in Canada, where all network affiliates contribute material that goes into a program assembled and anchored by each individual station, and aired on the same day. Ron Johnston and Pamela MacKenzie anchor the CKCO-TV program, station manager Al McKay of CJOH Ottawa was the man with the concept.

TERROR IN THE ANCHOR CHAIR ... it sounds like a bad movie but it could have been the title of Scan Weekend, Sunday, January 3/88. Brenda Irving was advised just minutes before air that BOTH ACR machines were down!!! Most stories in the first segment of the newscast were on . . . you guessed it, ACR. It was a short segment, Brenda apologized and the items made it to air

later in the half hour. A gray hair perhaps, but none the worse for the wear . . . Brenda kept her professional cool (despite that feeling of stark terror that creeps down your spine when you go to air knowing the technology isn't there).

John Matlock, just returned to CKCO from 'The Journal', has helped us utilize technology in our nightly newscasts. Joel Haslam interviewed Tom Selleck and Ted Danson from Los Angeles LIVE via satellite for his Friday night entertainment segment. It was a first for CKCO and went off without a hitch. We also used a satellite link in an interview with a Kitchener family carrying the Olympic Torch through the Kingston area. We're planning to use this technique more and more in our day to day coverage.

We're sorry to report photographer John Johnston is leaving us after 12 years or so. John has been in our Toronto bureau for the past few years after starting as a 'lab assistant' in the "olden days" when we used film. Wanting to do some travelling and take in the Calgary Olympics, John will be missed.

Radio News 'captain' Dave Carswell is counting the days 'til spring when he'll be able to get up and away again in his home built aircraft. It's a nifty little acrobatic machine that cost him a house . . . something about the wife saying, you've got your plane . . . I want a new house! Both are happy now (but they'll both likely be working for the rest of their lives to pay for it all).

SIMULSAT

Many people have asked what the big dish in the parking lot does, so we asked John Grant of the engineering department. His first answer was—It's a feeding dish for buzzards, we waited a week, none appeared.


His second answer explained what the dish does . . . The following is translated from engineering talk . . .

The SIMULSAT, simultaneously receives a number of different satellites from different spots in the sky. It has a capacity of 38 satellites at one time.

Each satellite has up to 24 signals on it, for a total of 912 channels.

Each channel can carry a video, and up to 10 audio signals.







CKCO-TV A big part of the XV Olympic Winter Games in Calgary

When you see the athletes at this Olympiad receive their medals, you'll see it through the facilities of CKCO-TV. CKCO-TV forms part of the host broadcast team that will provide pictures to over 50 countries and millions of people around the world.

Our remote unit will leave Ontario at the end of January and will be driven to the site by Paul Nyout and Brian Clemens. The location in Calgary is the Olympic Plaza, the site of the medal ceremonies and some cultural events. It's located downtown, across from the City Hall, and adjacent to the centre for Performing Arts.

This facility includes an ice-skating rink, water fountain, and lighting for night use. Every evening during the Games a portable floor will be moved across the surface of the ice so that the medal ceremonies can take place there. We will use a five camera mobile that will cover all presentations, plus scenic shots of the Plaza and downtown Calgary.

The CKCO-TV crew consists of Henning Grumme, Paul Nyhout, Dave McNeil, Bob Tiffen, Ken Elliott, Dan Sloane, Kevin Doerr, Dan Bailey, Alex Spiridonov, Randy Ricketts, Brian Clemens, Zeljko Zugaj, and Paul Francescutti. Jeff Hutcheson of C A P Sports who has handled events for Wide World of Sports and other events such




Calgary's Olympic Plaza

Jamie Niven On Air With Betty Thompson

CRUST

1-1/3 cups Graham wafer crumbs 1/4 cup packed brown sugar

1/3 cup melted butter

1/2 tsp. cinnamon

Thoroughly mix crumbs, sugar and cinnamon—then melted butter. Put a little bit of the mixture aside for topping meringue. Press into 9 inch pie plate and bake at 375° for eight minutes. Cool before filling.

PIE FILLING

1/2 cup cold water

7 tblsp. corn starch

1/4 tsp. salt

1 cup white sugar

1 cup boiling water

3 egg yolks, slightly beaten

2 tbsp. butter

1 tsp. ground coriander

1 tsp. grated lemon peel

1/2 cup lemon juice

Mix together corn starch, salt and cold water. Add sugar and boiling water gradu-

ally. Bring mixture to a boil—lower heat—cook and stir for 10 minutes. Stir about 1/2 cup of hot mixture into egg yolks. Mix well and blend that back into rest of hot mixture. Stir and cook over low heat for 3 minutes. Blend in butter, coriander, lemon peel and juice. Stir for 2 minutes and allow to cool. Put into pie shell and top with meringue.

MERINGUE

3 egg whites

3 tbsp. sugar

Beat egg whites and gradually add lemon juice, then sugar. Cover pie and add sprinkling of crust mixture on top. Bake at 350° for 15 minutes or until lightly browned. Let pie cool then chill in fridge before serving.



Video-Q Goes Microwave

Video-Q has made significant technological changes since our last column. Most of our stores now receive the Video-Q program via microwave. This allows us to make changes in program material as required.

With this new facility we are able to keep viewers up-to-date on weather reports, sports results and up-date other information daily or more often, if required.

In addition to our microwave facilities, we have installed a 1/2" VHS editing facility, and character generator which allows us to make necessary changes.

This system, coupled with the addition of new 1/2" HQ machines has greatly

improved the quality of the Video-Q program in the stores.

Our office in Toronto is located at 20 Eglinton Avenue West, Suite 1109. Our transmitter is located in the same complex right at the corner of Yonge and Eglinton.
