

Our new anchorman?... We'll give you the complete story on the new NEWS operation in the next issure of CAPsule.





THE NEW LOOK



age, the music, the set . . it all has John's stamp all over it and gives us a very professional on-air image. Thanks John!!


NAMES IN THE NEWS...



AM 109's Glenn Turchan and Todd Aitchison (lost in the balloons) help out aboard the CKKW bus during the Santa Claus Parade.




AM 109's Tino Monte and Linda Brooks along with CFCA's Dan Fisher help the city of Kitchener open up their brand new transportation centre.




Santa gets emotionally involved with Bob Smith. (Note hands)


