

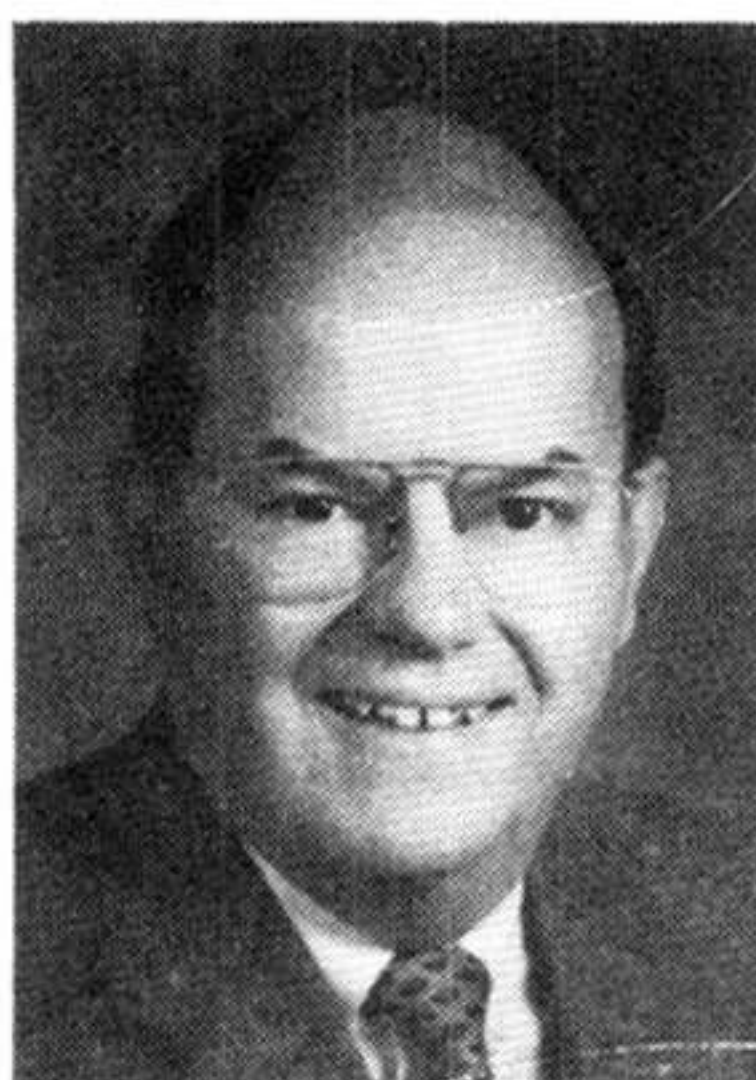

much acclaim with their John Grant designed 'Nerd Pak' . . .

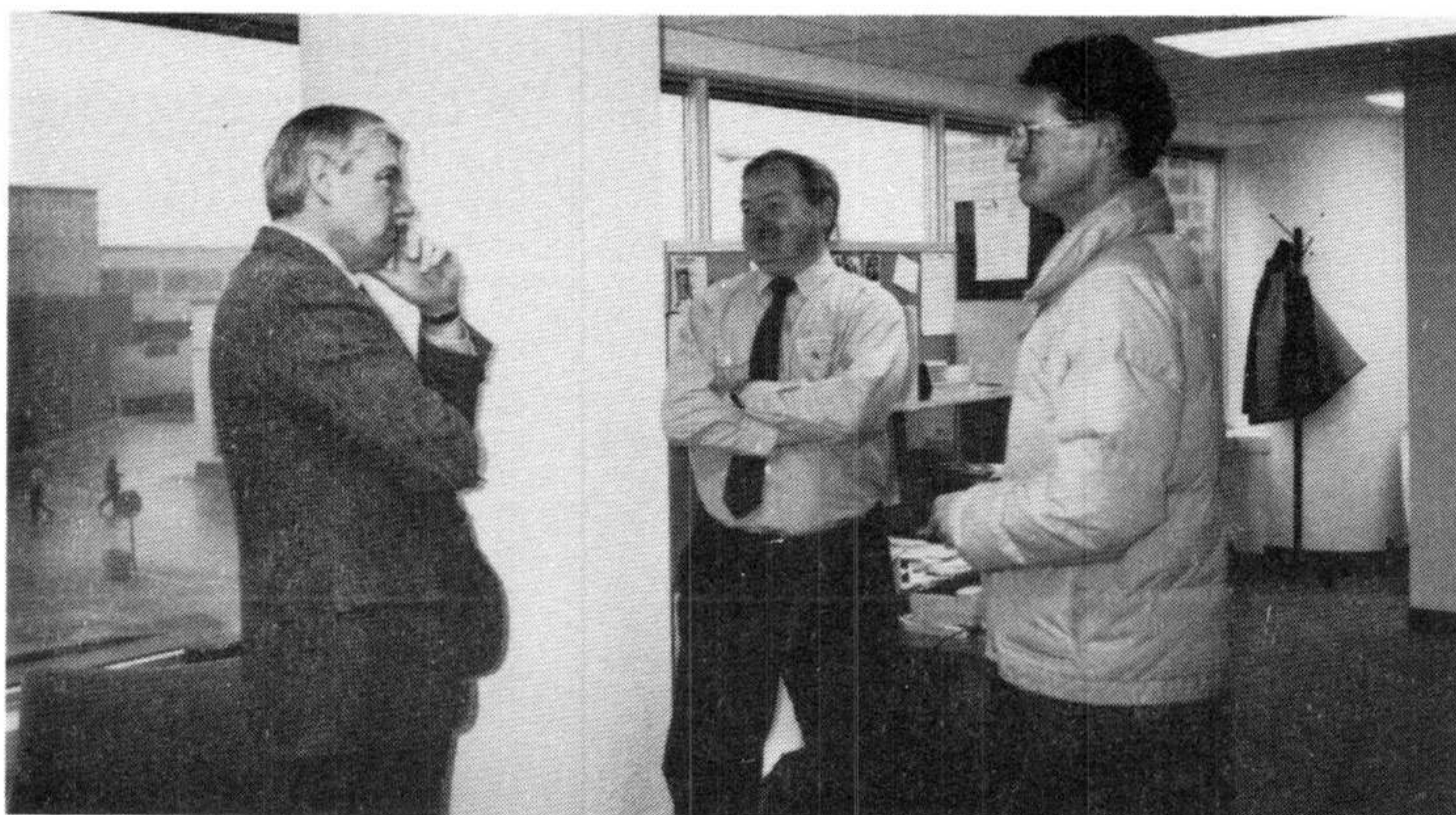
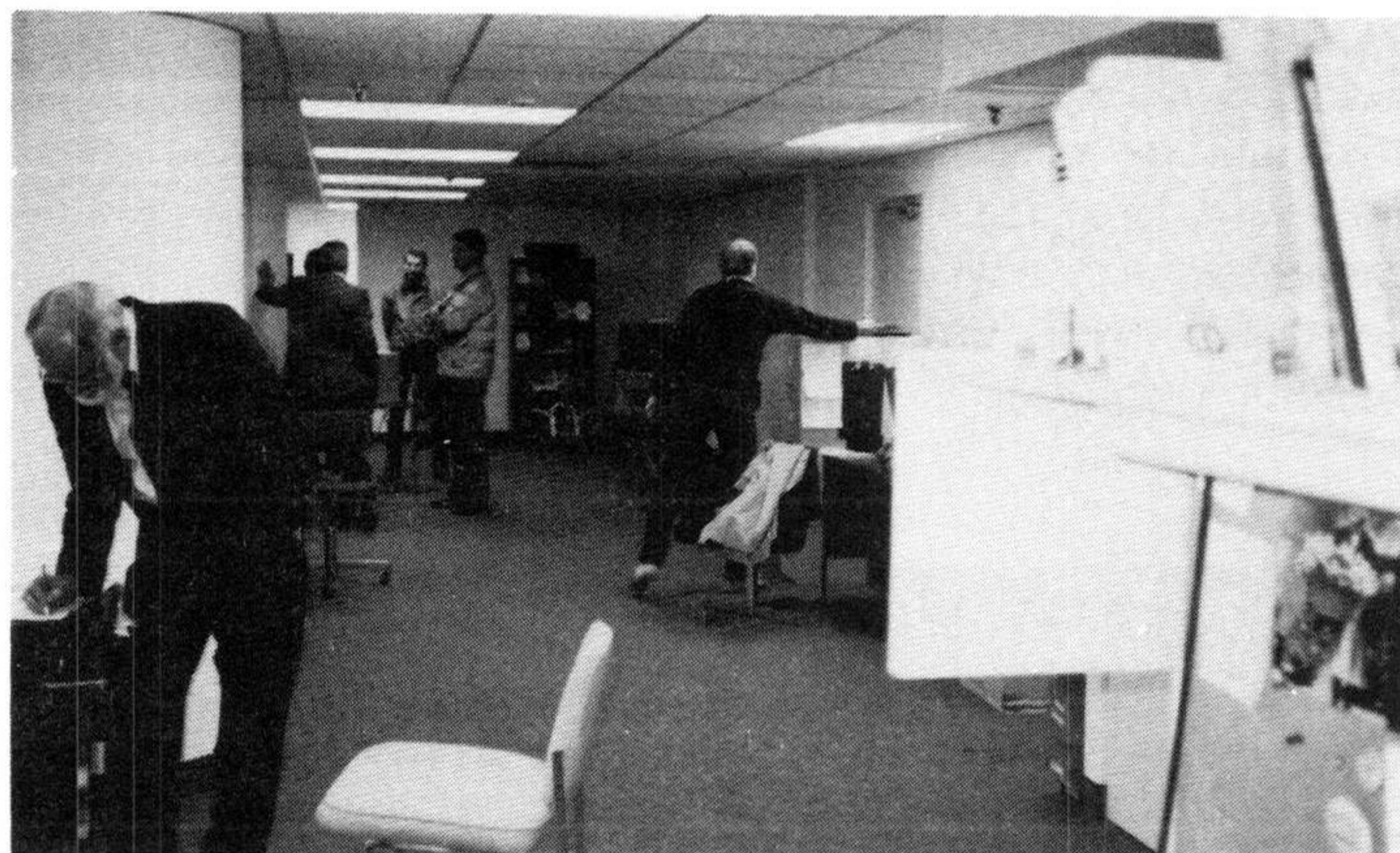

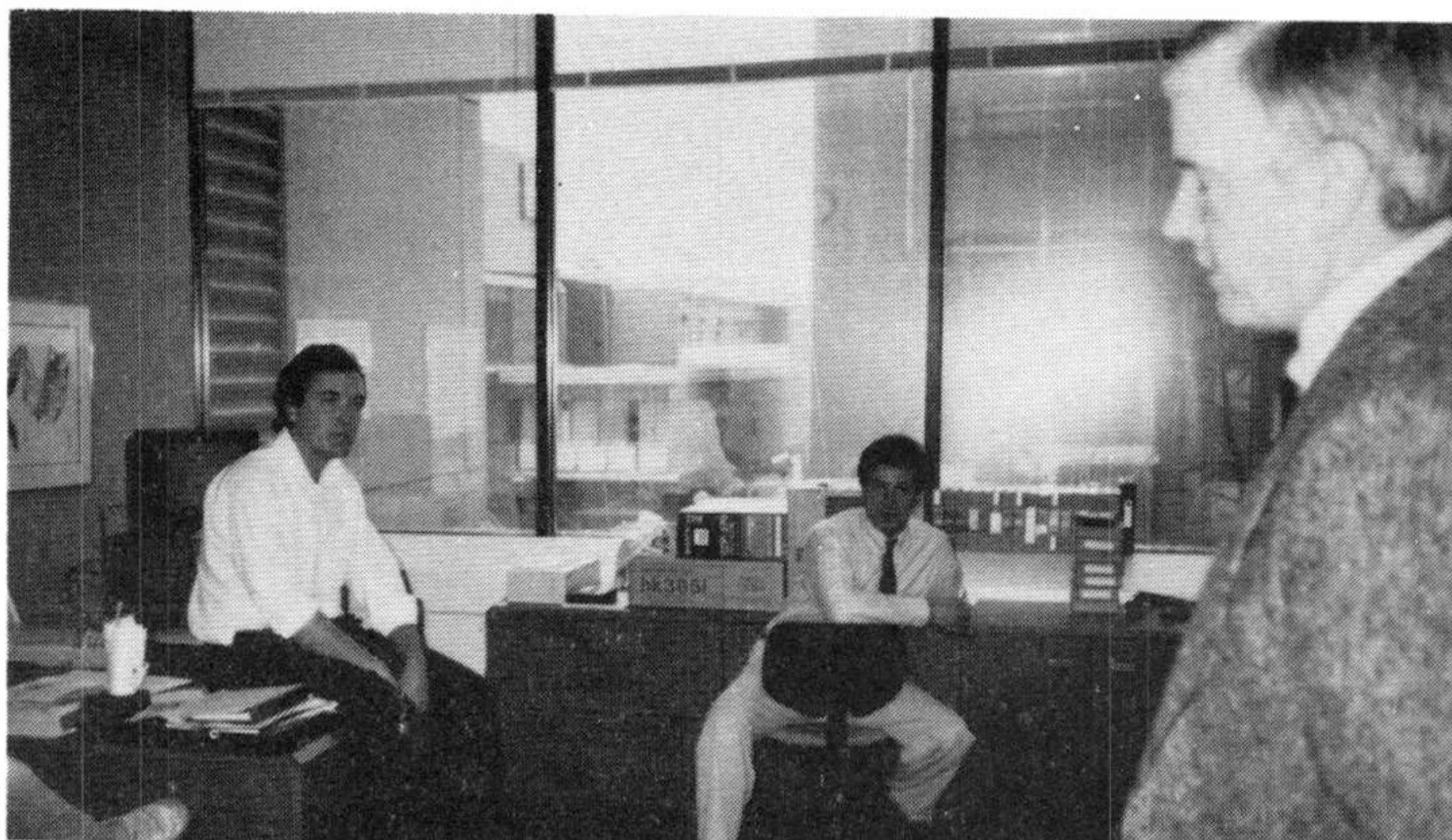
News Bureaus
