
In Business Windsor editor **Alan Halberstadt** is a regular guest on a new






### CKCO-TV Presents TEEN VIDEO


### Notes from Nabet

With negotiations in mind (our first meeting set for October 25) I'd like to share something I read in a magazine recently. Unfortunately, the author is unknown.

#### A Day Off

So you want a day off. Let's take a look at what you are asking for. There are 365 days per year available for work. There are 52 weeks per year in which you already have 2 days off per week. This leaves 261 days available for work. Since you spend 16 hours each day away from work, you have used up 170 days, leaving only 91 days available. You spend 30 minutes each day on coffee break. That accounts for 23 days each year, leaving only 68 days available and with a one hour lunch period each day, you use up another 48 days leaving only 22 days available for work. 

### H.M.S. Brave




Gary McLaren ran a feature on SUN-DAY AM about the Royal Navy Frigate H.M.S. Brave, as did Jack Carpenter on his 'Music Hall' program on CFCA, during the ships' friendly visit to Lake Ontario. In turn a group of Officers from the ship paid us a visit to tour the station and spend a day in Kitchener-Waterloo. As interesting as the men proved to be, it was the ship that was the star.

H.M.S. Brave is one of the newest ships to join the British fleet, where the

frigate is the mainstay of the modern, compact Royal Navy surface fleet. She is capable of defending herself and attacking targets above, on or below the sea.

H.M.S. Brave displaces 5,000 tonnes, is 150 metres long and has a crew of 260. The ship is powered by four gas turbine engines (similar to the Concorde), 2 Tyne for low power and 2 new Spey, all produced by Rolls-Royce. The power is transmitted through two shafts to controllable pitch propellers, all controlled by two levers, on the bridge or in the Ship Control Centre. The response from the power unit gives the ship the capability of going from a standing start to full speed of 30+ Knots in two minutes and from full speed to reverse in two and a half ship lengths.


Besides a galaxy of 'state of the art' technology the computer plays a major role in the sophisticated sensor and weapon systems on the ship. Among its arsenal are 2x Triple Torpedo Tubes, 4 Exocet Missiles, and a Seawolf Antimissile missile system with a muzzle



velocity close to Mach 3.


The **Brave** can carry two Lynx Hellicopters, or one Sea King, as it did on this trip. Besides the obvious, the Sea King with its own sensors and weapons, including Sea Skua missiles and torpedos, can extend the ship's area of interest considerably.

The **Brave** is a new breed of naval vessel, and our visitors a new breed of sailor.
