### Bob McLean Named Honorary Citizen of Windsor

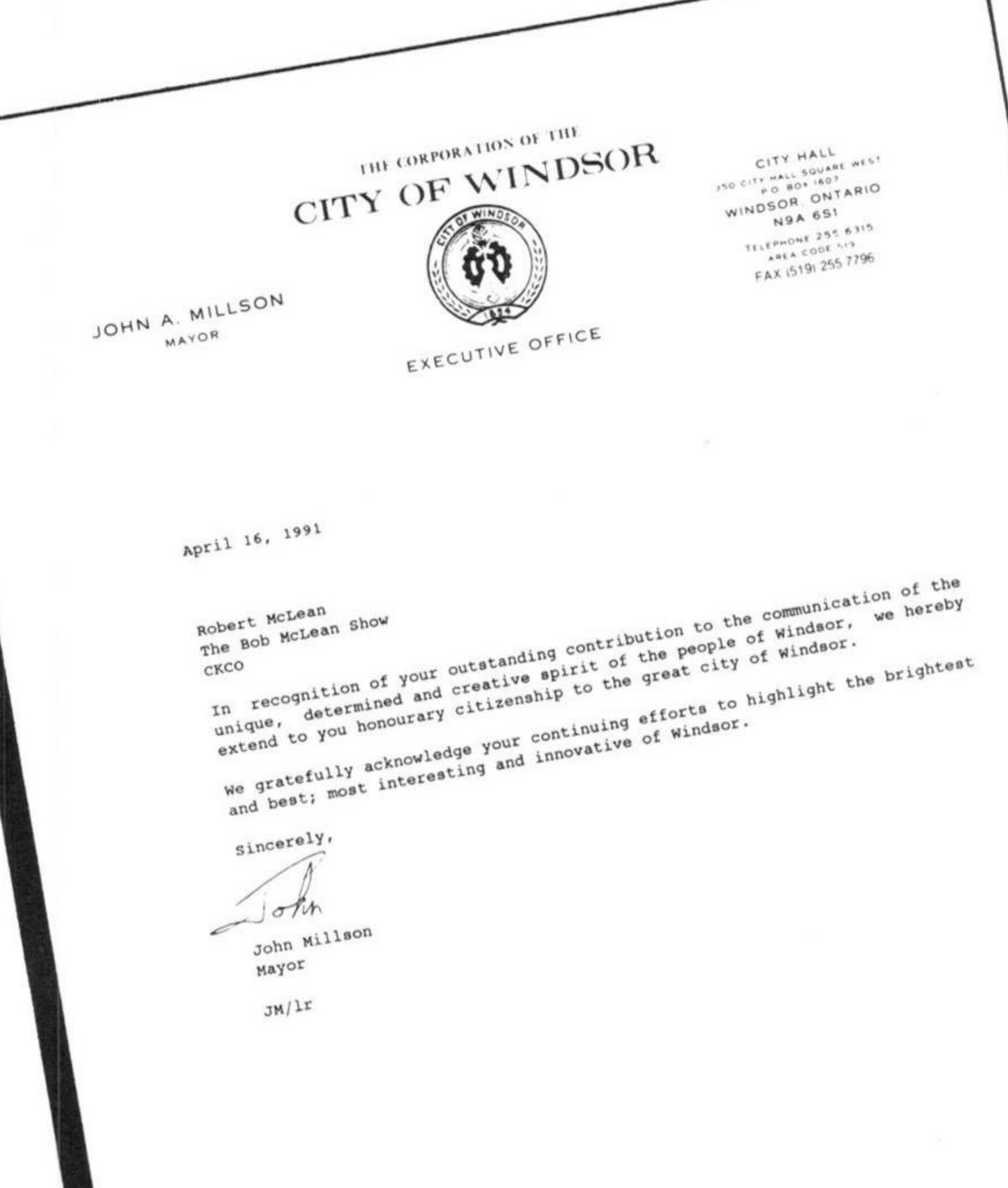

### New Provincial Network Peter Jackman, Manager TV

I thought it might be a good idea to bring you up-to-date on the Ontario Network Television. No doubt you have seen a new logo appearing on the Blue Jays telecasts. Baton Broadcasting and C A P Communications (CKCO-TV) have joined to form this new provincial network. Ontario Network Television is comprised of CFTO-TV Toronto, CJOH Ottawa and the Mid Canada System, all operated by Baton, and CKCO-TV of Kitchener, operated by C A P Communications, with all rebroadcasters, Muskoka, Georgian Bay and Southwestern Ontario. The Ontario Network is initially carrying Ontario telecasts of Blue Jays Baseball, and there is more programming planned for the fall. The network effectively covers most of the province, with a combination reach of well over 7 million. This network of communities will enable advertisers the reach virtually all of the provincial population with a single buy, providing a most viable alternative to Global and selective buying. This is a strategic fresh new force in Canadian programming and advertising that we are very optimistic of.

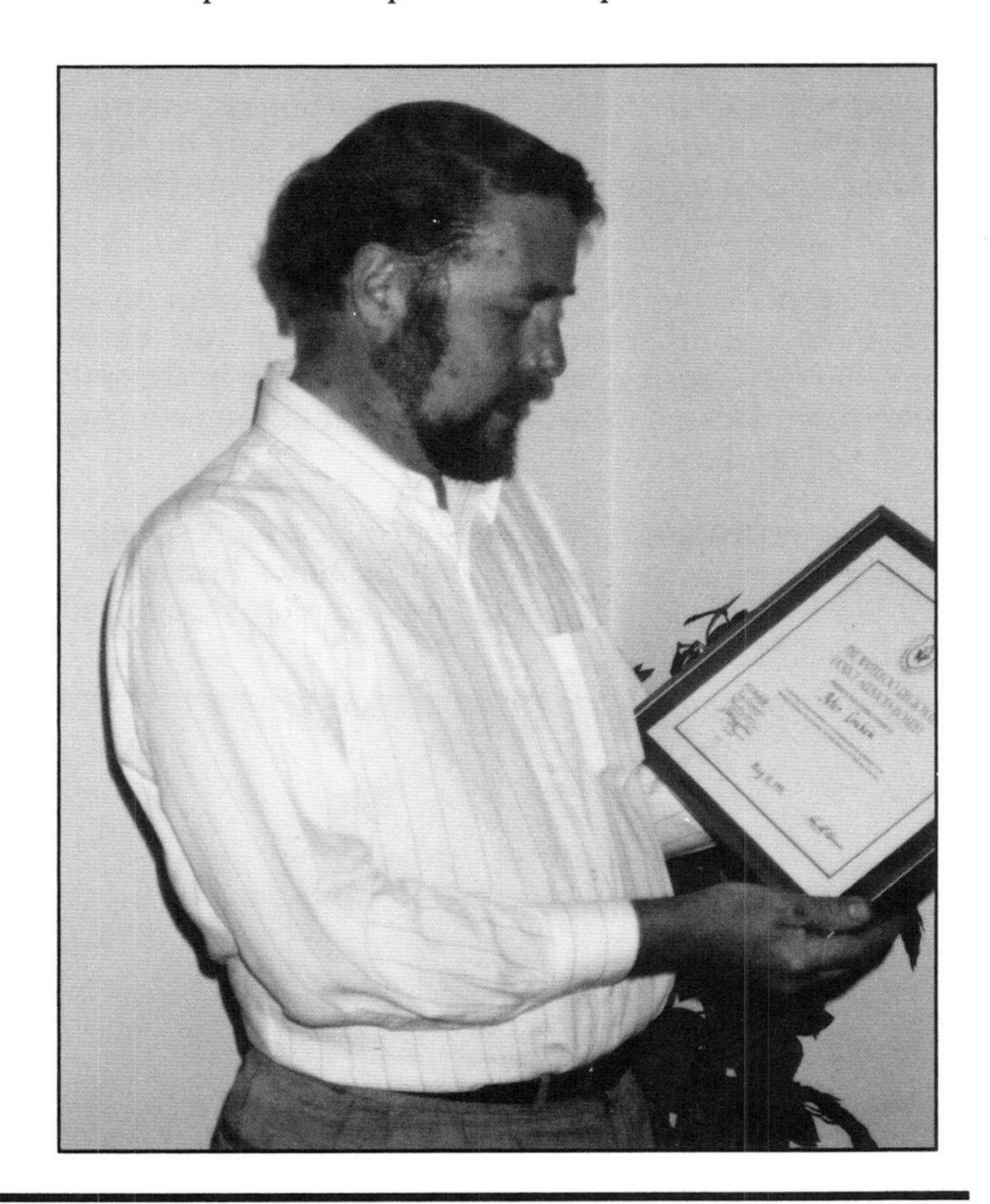

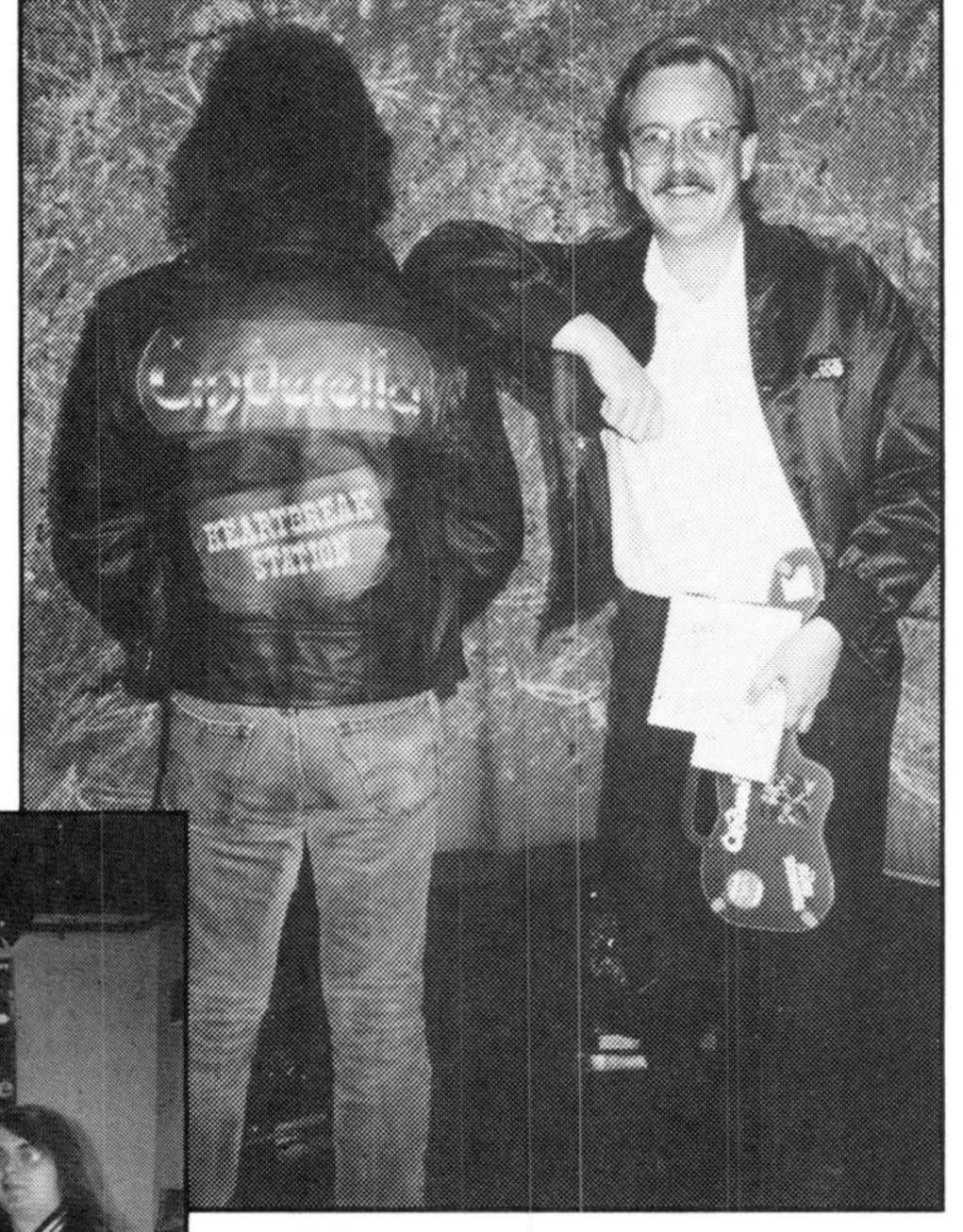

Strange Days emerged as the winner when they competed against over 20 other local bands who entered the 1990 edition of "Future Rock", an AM 109 contest for local bands.

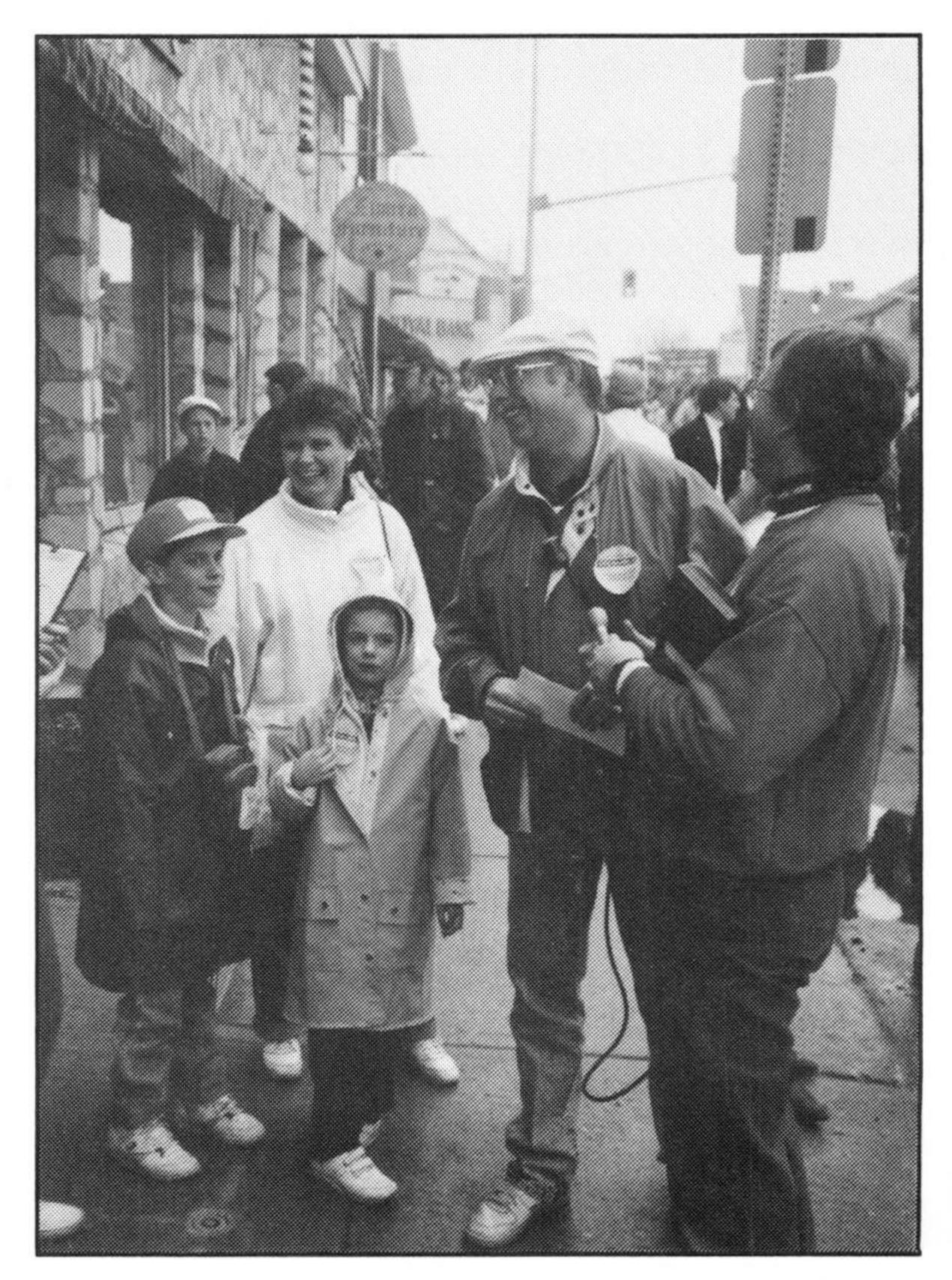
### Elmira Maple Syrup Festival

# What is M-II? A High Quality Component Format by GeorgeMoskal

You have probably wondered why all of a sudden our photographers, tape editors and news personnel have been walking around with smiles on their faces. The reason, M-II has arrived.

For the past few years, we have been evaluating various formats to replace the obsolete "M-I" Y-I-Q component format for ENG (Electronic News Gathering) and EFP (Electronic Field Production) which has served us well.

Why M-II?

Because of superior quality of both video and audio, C A P Communications is committed to a total Digital format, but until recently, a single unit Digital Camcoder was not available. We therefore had to find an interim format.

We evaluated Beta SP, M-II, S-VHS and Hi-8 as possible formats. We found that Beta SP & M-II were by far the most superior video formats.

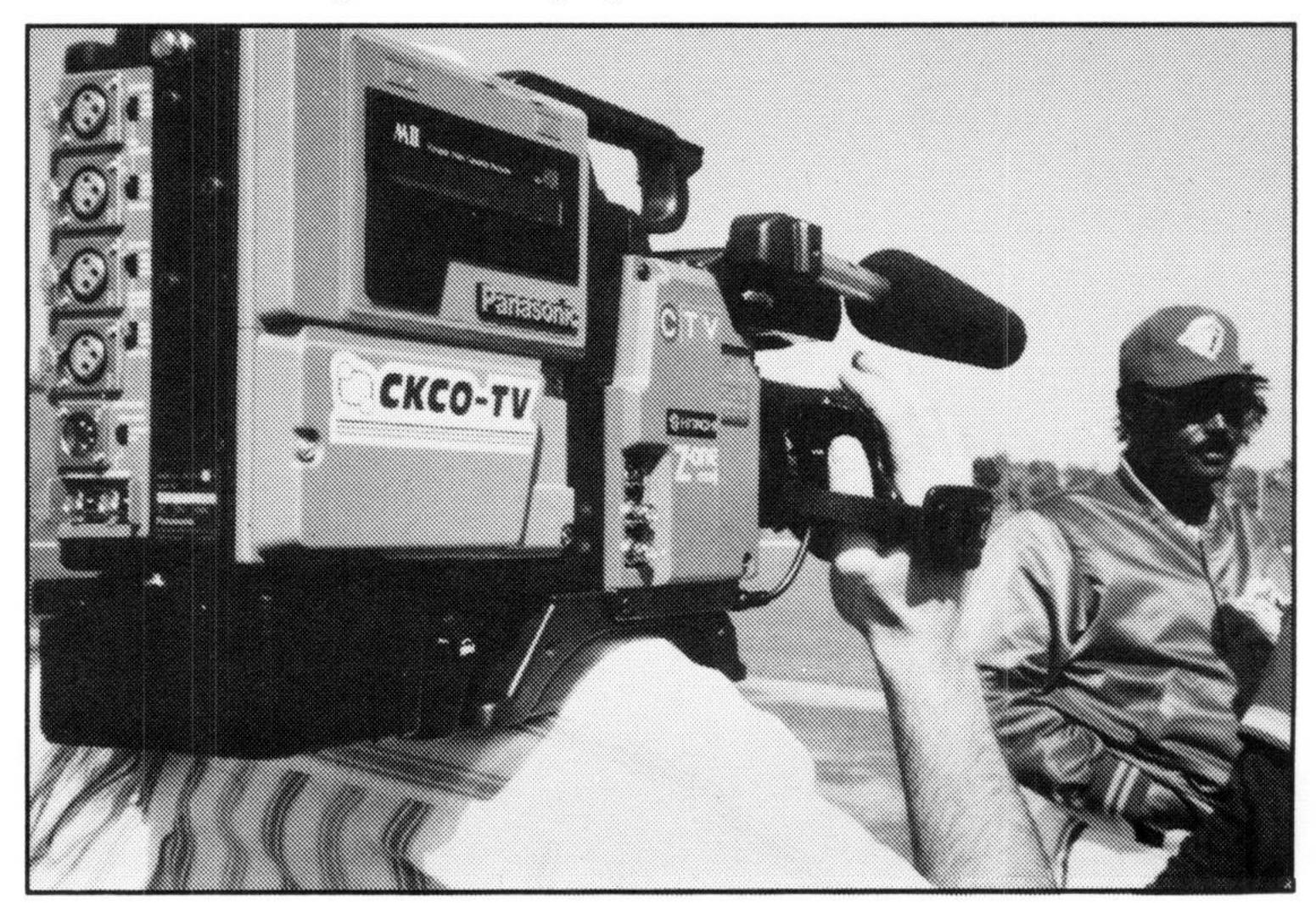
As Beta SP and M-II were of equal video quality and this was to be an interim format, price as well as quality played a large part in the final format decision. M-II won over Beta SP by a wide margin.

We purchased seven M-II Camcorders for both ENG and EFP and equipped four edit suites and a dub centre with M-II format "Source" machines. This enables us to shoot and edit directly from M-II to Digital D2, then go to air in the digital format.

Our local News, Commercials and Programs shot in M-II have shown a vast and immediate improvement in our "Off Air" video and audio quality.

As previously mentioned, this is an interim step in CKCO-TV's policy of acquiring digital equipment over analog wherever possible.

Our next step, when available, will be to replace the ENG and EFP M-II Camcorders and recorders with Digital "DX" (½" Digital format) or "D-8" (8mm Digital format) and replace the bureaus and regions ¾" equipment with M-II.

## Sunday-AM and the Gulf War by Gary McLaren



Back in late October 1990, I arranged through the public affairs office at National Defense Headquarters in Ottawa, to send each week 3 VHS copies of "Sunday A.M." to the 3 Canadian ships serving in the Persian Gulf.

Each week the program was recorded on VHS cassettes, sent by Priority Post to Canadian Forces Base, Trenton and from there the cassettes were sent by regular military flights to the Middle East. Each ship received a cassette, the destroyers HMCS Athabaskan and HMCS Terra Nova, and the supply ship HMCS Protecteur.

Lt. Commander Ian Thomson, who served for 4 and a half months on board the ships and at the Canadian Base in Bahrain, said the ship's crews were able to receive little news or information about events back in Canada. Accordingly, he said, they were hungry for any information and stories from Canada, and the "Sunday A.M." programs were a welcome and much watched addition to their library of video material.

There are 3 "MESSES" or lounges, aboard each ship, Officers, NCO's and Seamen, the the cassettes rotated from one mess to the other each week.

The Canadian Forces personnel were from all parts of Canada, and since "Sunday A.M." always contains stories and reports from across the country, many of the men and women were able to see something from their community or region, and this was an added attraction.

We also commenced sending a cassette to the Canadian Base at Bahrain early in 1991, continued the shipments to the ships and the base until the war ended.

Lt. Commander Thomson, from the Canadian Forces Maritime Command, presents a "Certificate of Appreciation" to CKCO-TV, in appreciation of our support to the men and women of the Canadian Forces serving in Bahrain and aboard the 3 Canadian ships during the Persian gulf crisis.

The "Sunday A.M." VHS cassettes contained the program as it went to air, complete with commercial, and the regular morning news, sports and weather report.

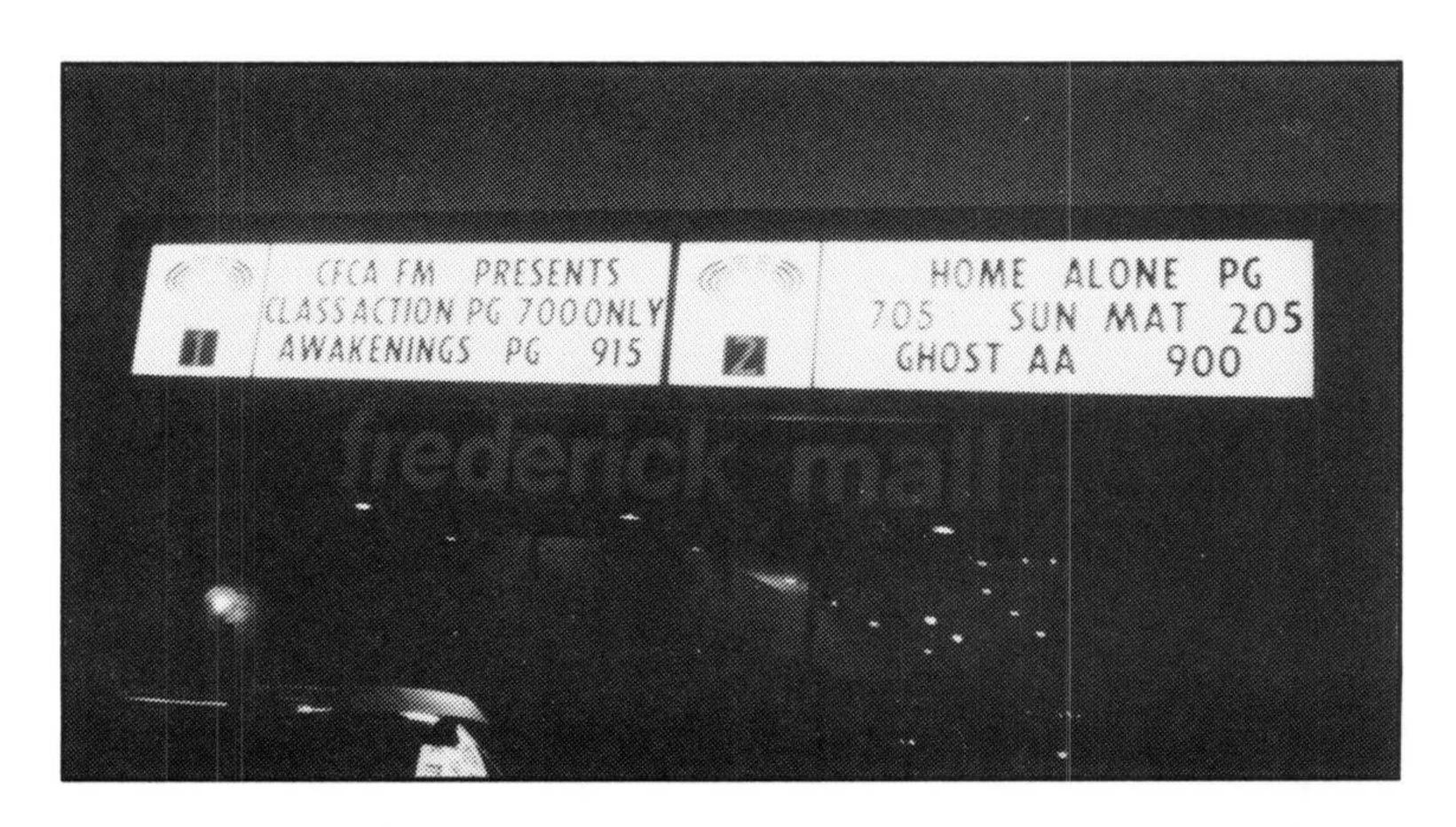
### Class Action

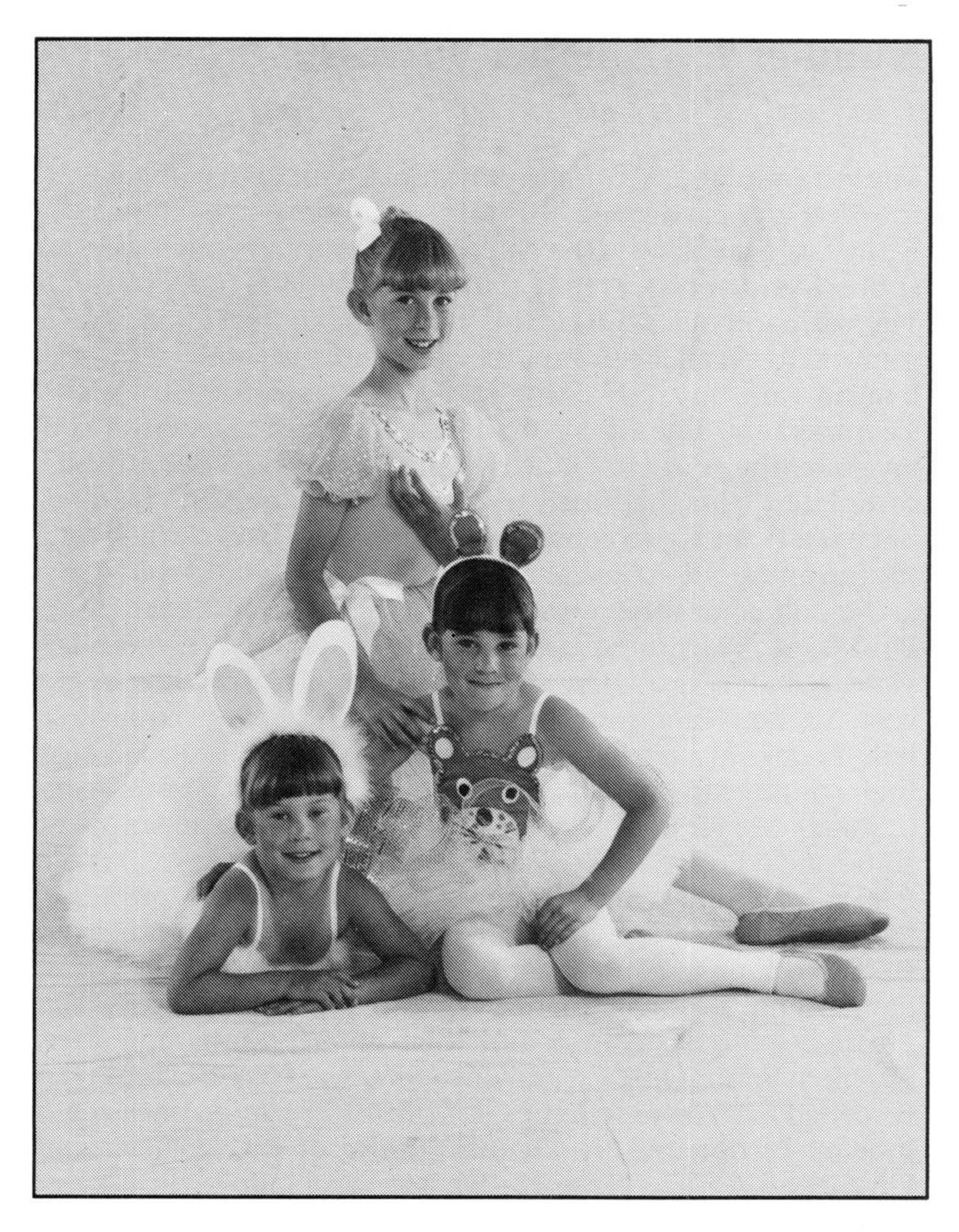
