


TV MASTER CONTROL CHANGES

The "ON AIR" control room for CKCO-TV was recently rebuilt to modernize the switching and monitoring facilities. With more split programming and commercial breaks being switched from this area, a more user friendly layout was required.

The project started with investigation of video/audio switchers that would simplify the operation of running a multi-station ON AIR control room. The selection was made easy once we determined the manufacturer of our routing switcher also made a multi-station master control switcher. The ease of tying the systems together and the performance and reliability confirmed our initial decision.


Once the switcher selection was completed meetings were held with operations personnel to determine the best room configuration. Drawings were produced, and after much discussion and compromise the present layout was achieved. The new facility provides room for the operator to feel comfortable, and able to concentrate on the fast paced and varied tasks without being cramped. The room is insulated and isolated from the hectic environment of



master control to reduce distractions and provide a calm, quiet area to properly monitor all outgoing signals.


The budget for master control was approved in April and construction started in May. The old "ONAIR" switching area was moved (to temporary, cramped quarters) while the new control room was built and equipped. After several weeks of training (it only seemed liked days) the system was switched to air on October 14th.


The start-up glitches have been few considering the heart bypass operation that was just completed. Minor items are being completed but the end result is a top-notch facility. The flexibility built in will allow us to more easily change and adapt to future requirements.



The other group that requires recognition are master control techs and especially the operators and crew chiefs who provided ideas, shared their insight and tolerated difficult conditions to receive their reward on the other side.

Thanks for the assistance and input to make the project a success. The changes continue in TV Master Control as other areas are redeveloped to improve your work areas.









PHANTOM CONTEST DRAWS BIG...






CAP CHRISTMAS CARDS

CAP's Vice President & General Manager Don Willcox, presents a cheque of Bob Broad, Unit President of the Canadian Cancer Society to mark the festive season.



















ROTARIANS VISIT CAP


OKTOBERFEST 1992


