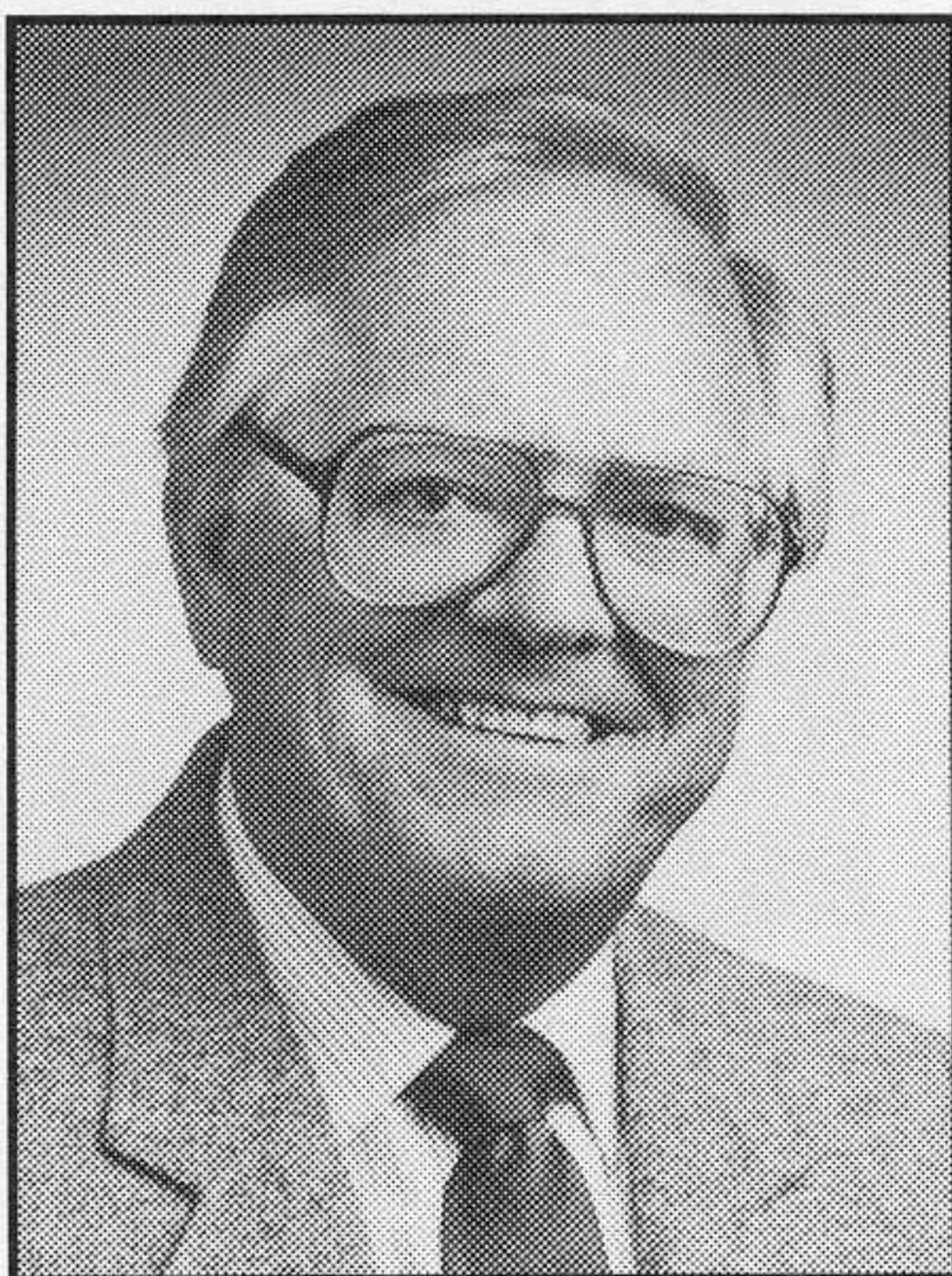
Bill Inkol

CKCO-TV is owned and operated by **CAP** Communications a division of Electrohome Limited.

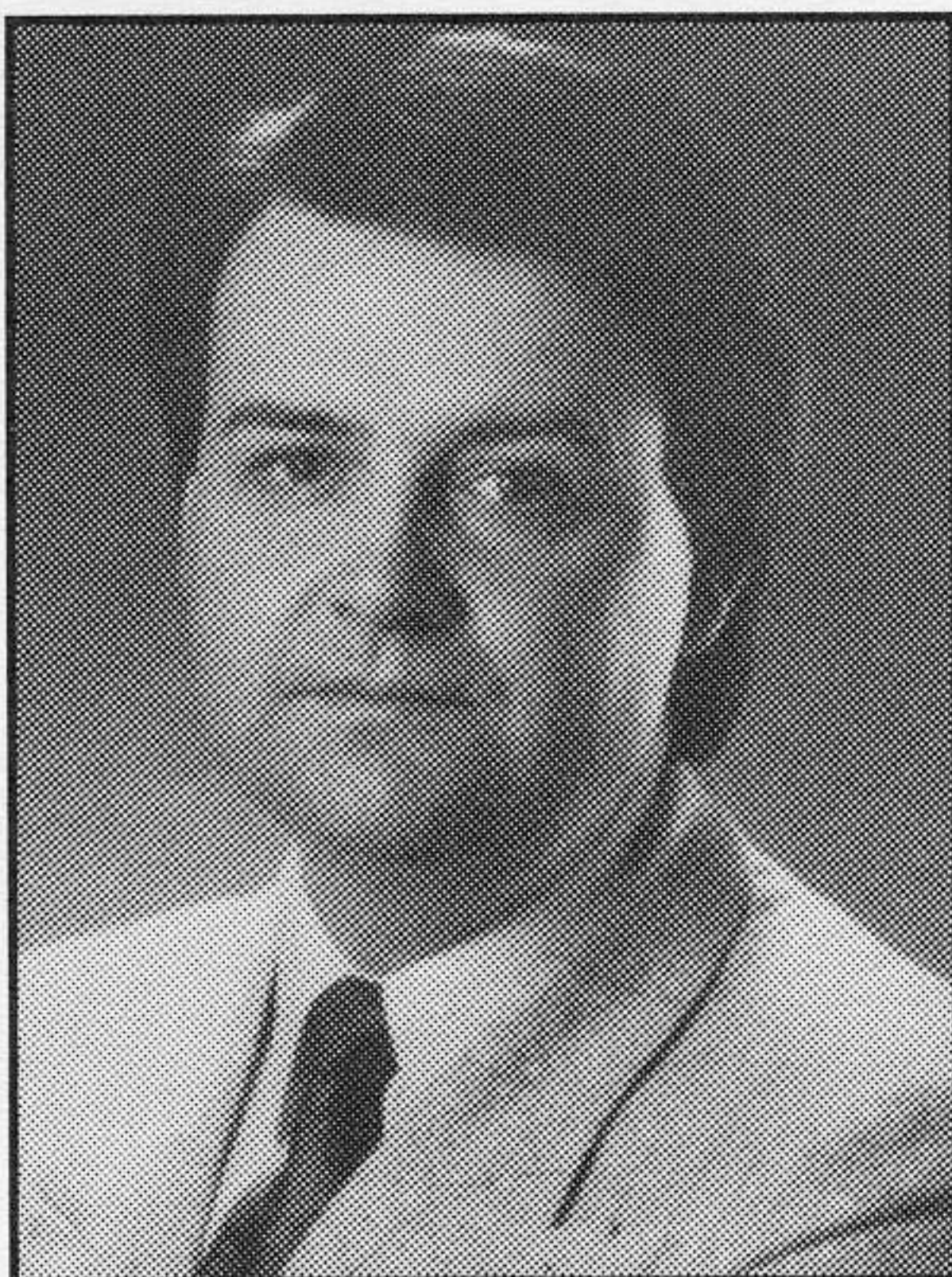


Jeff Hutcheson

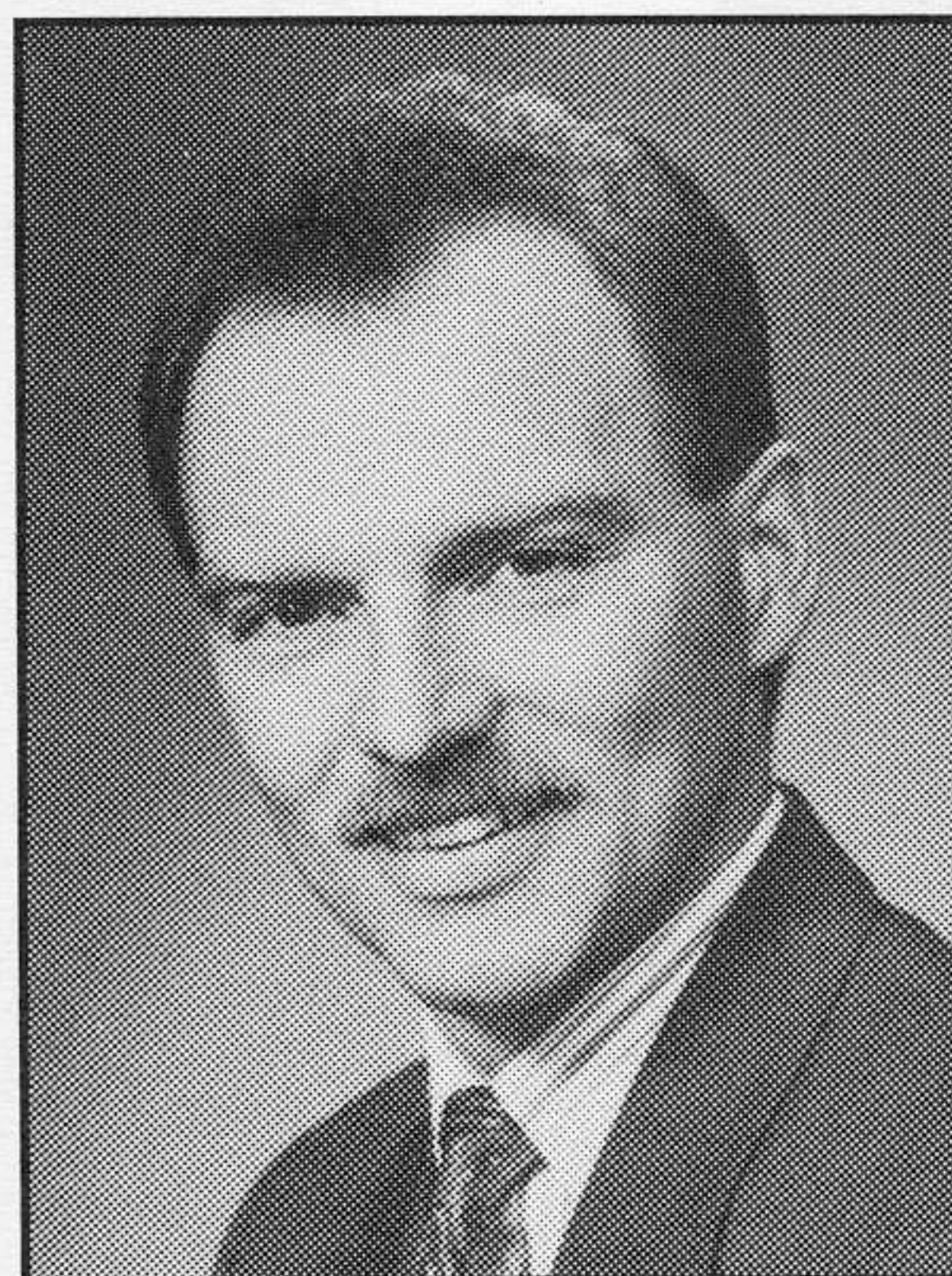


Scott Hammond

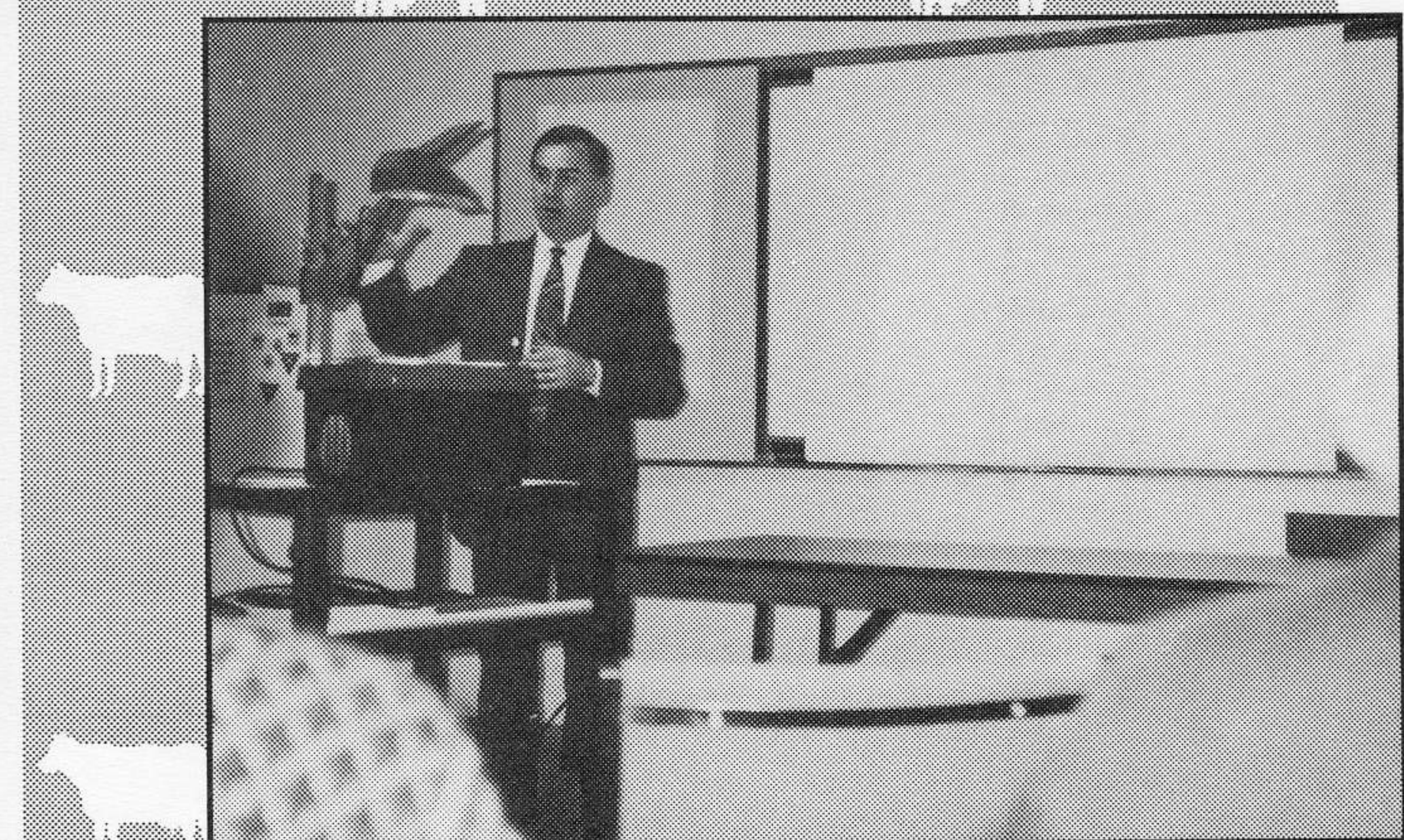
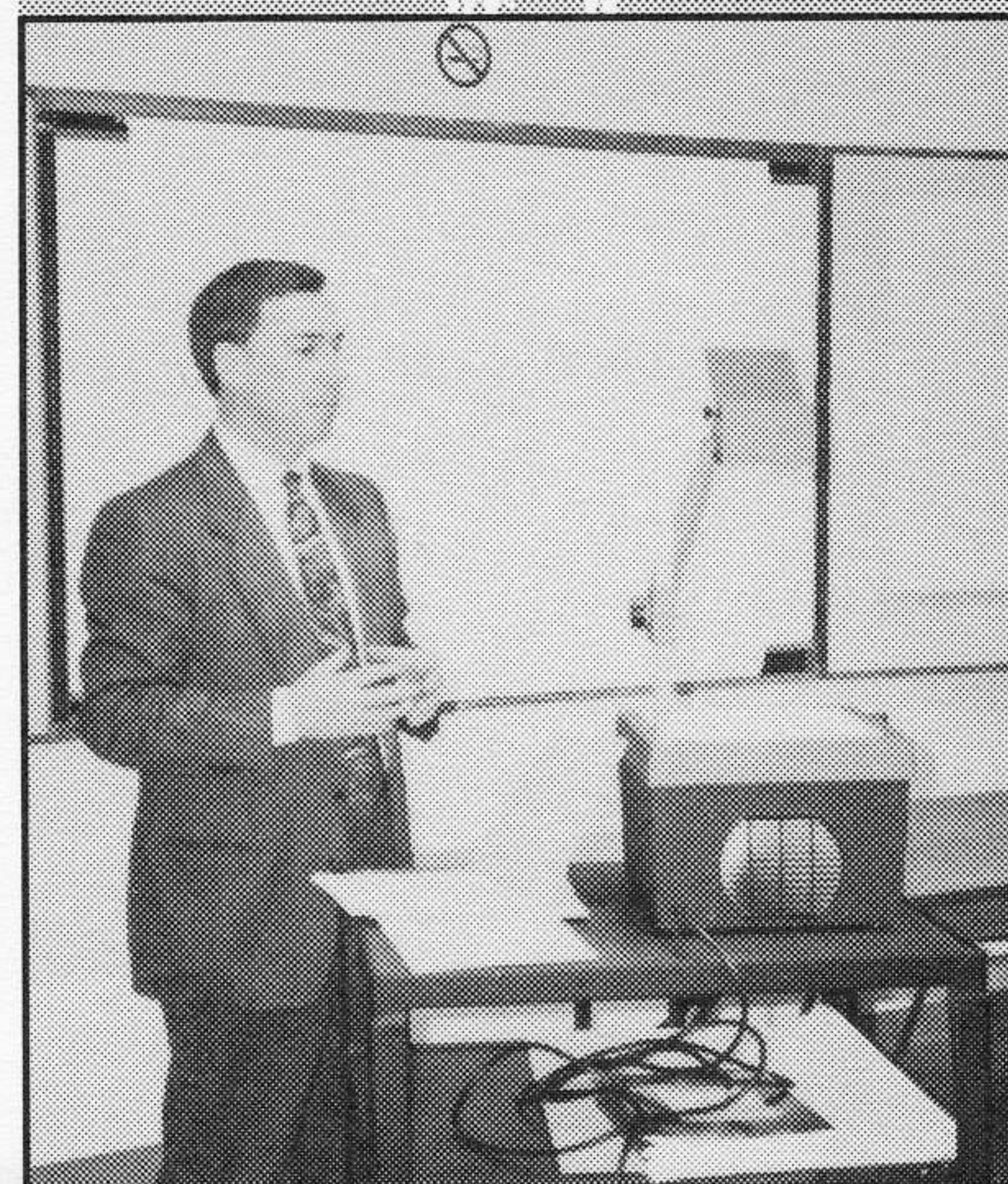
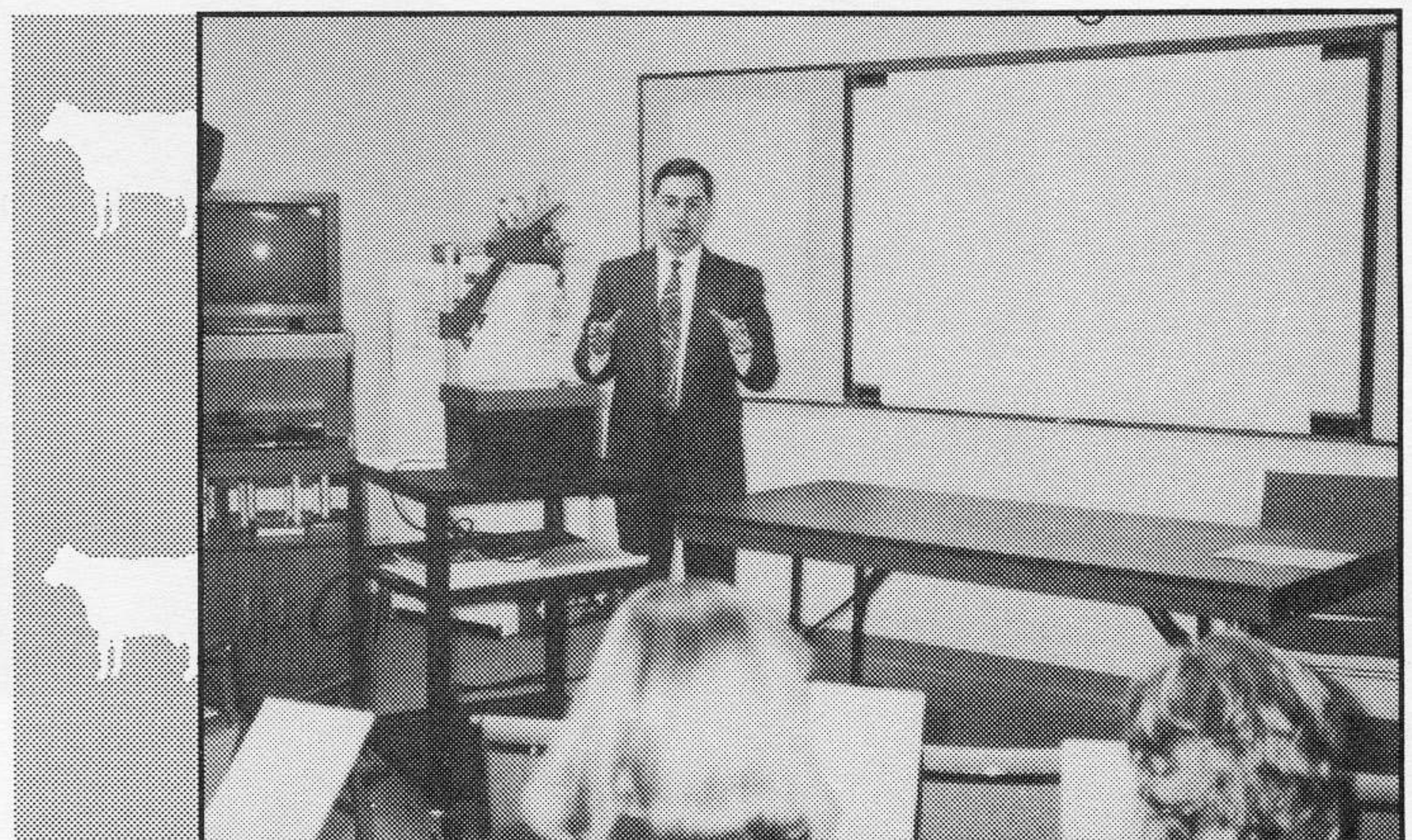
Mr. Hammond, a native of Bracebridge, was educated and employed in the hospitality and sales industry in the region over the past years.

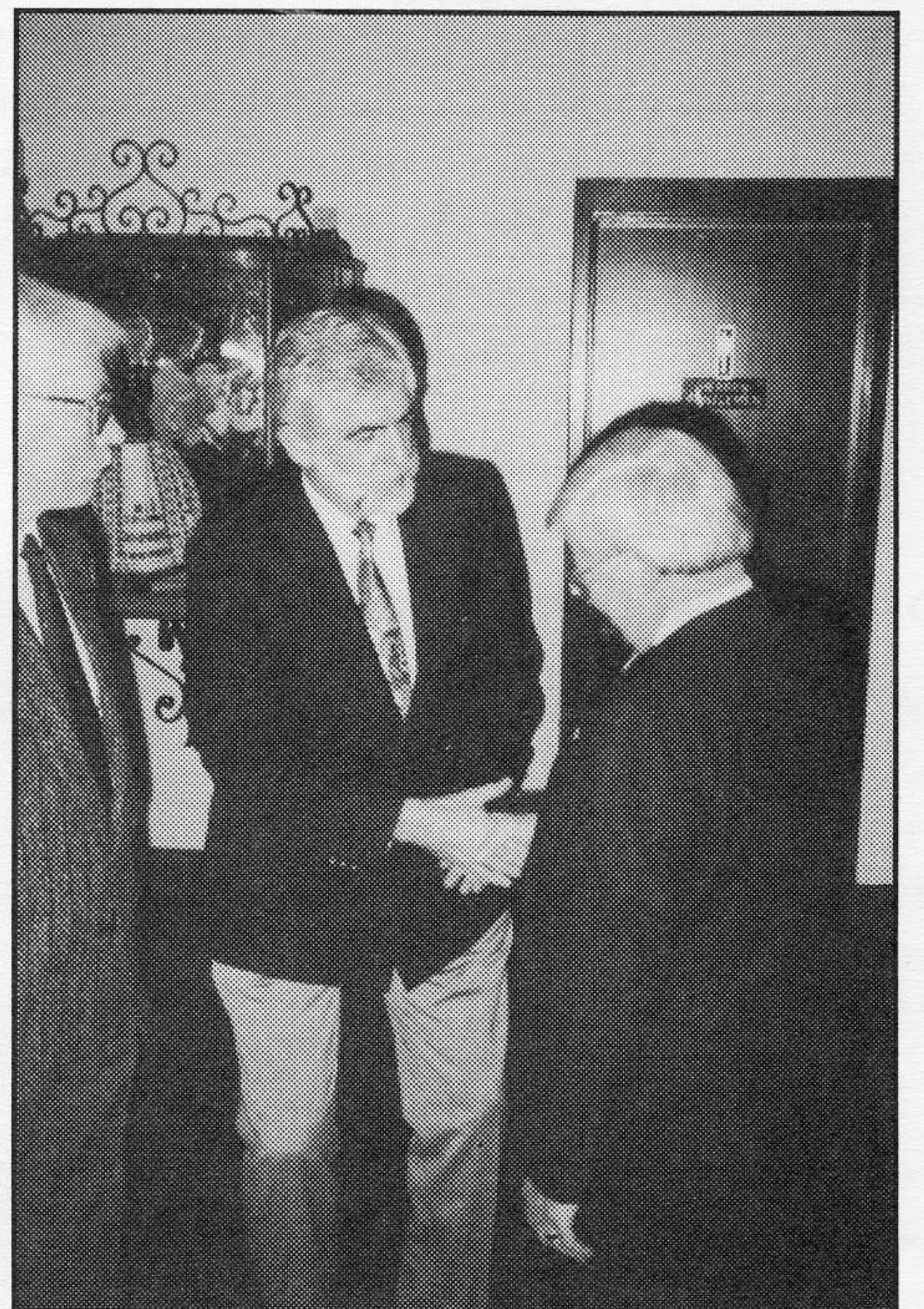
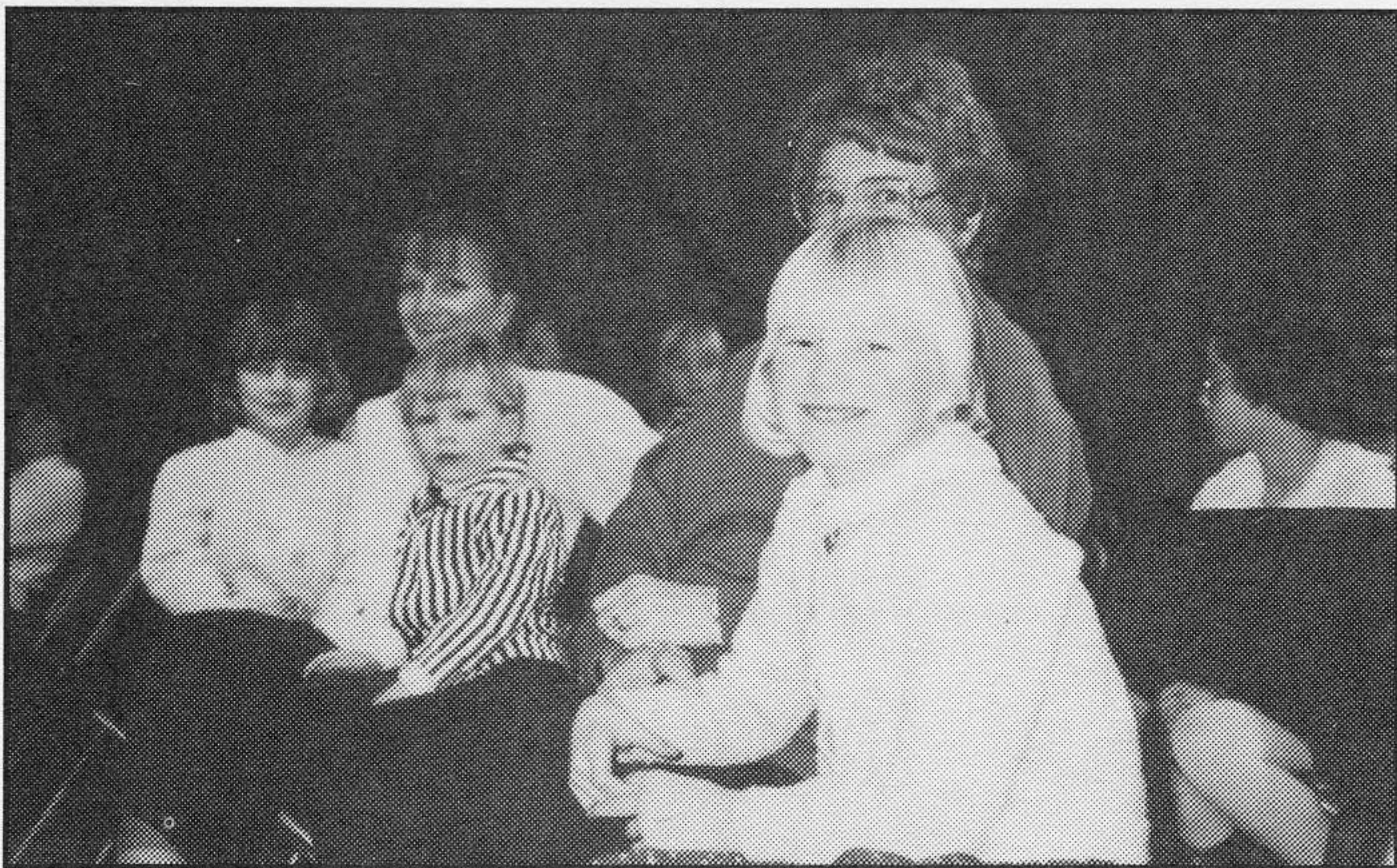
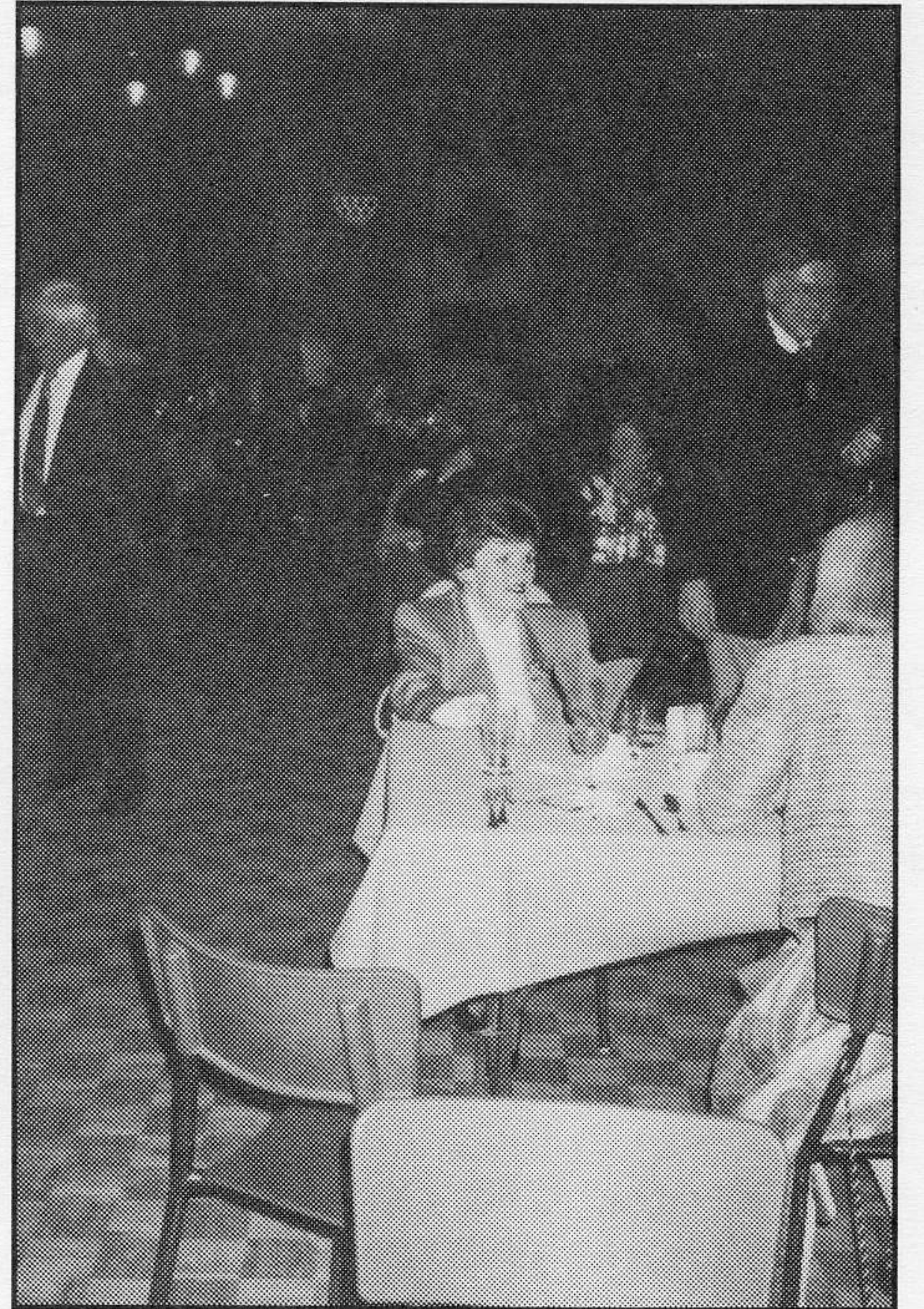
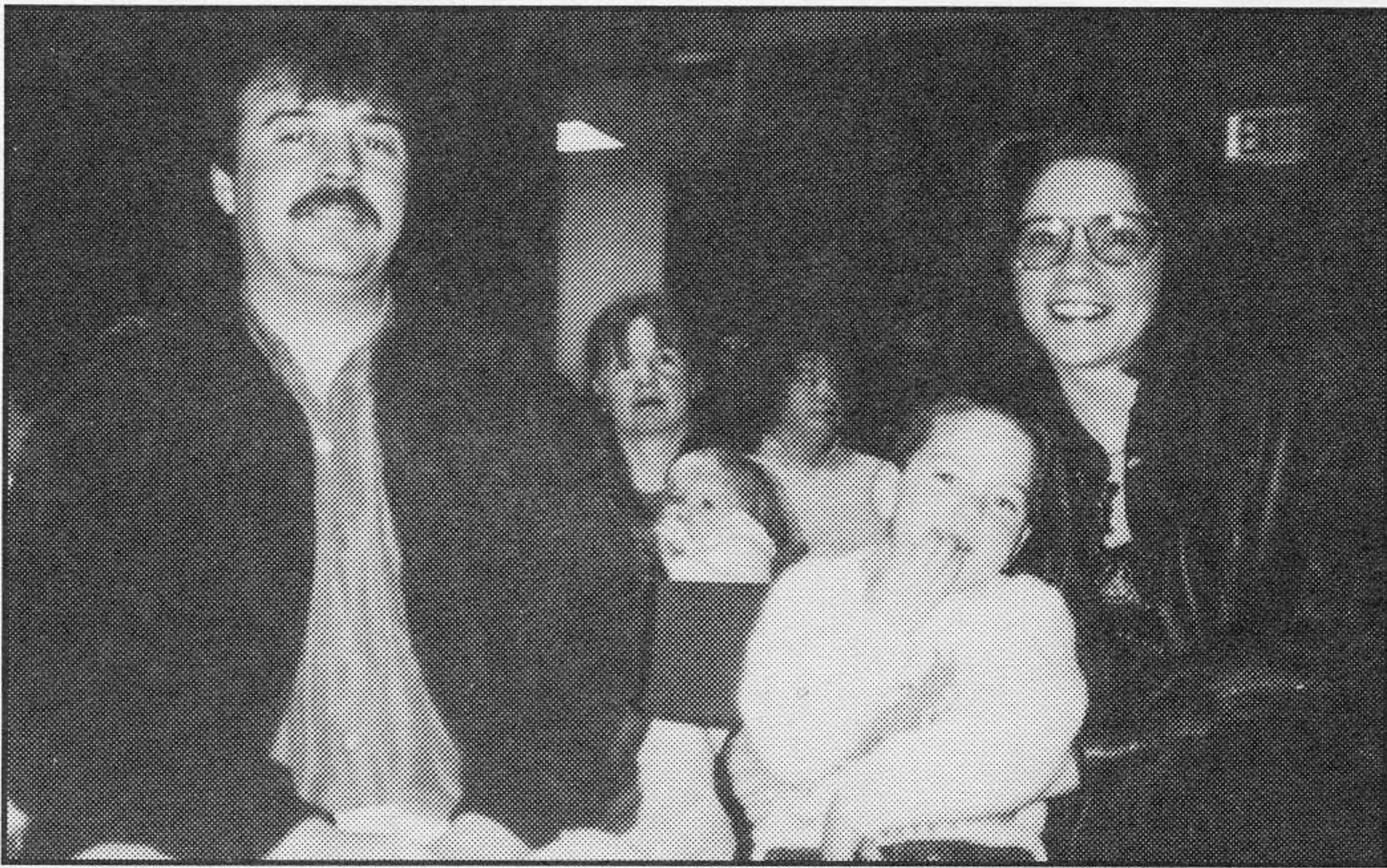
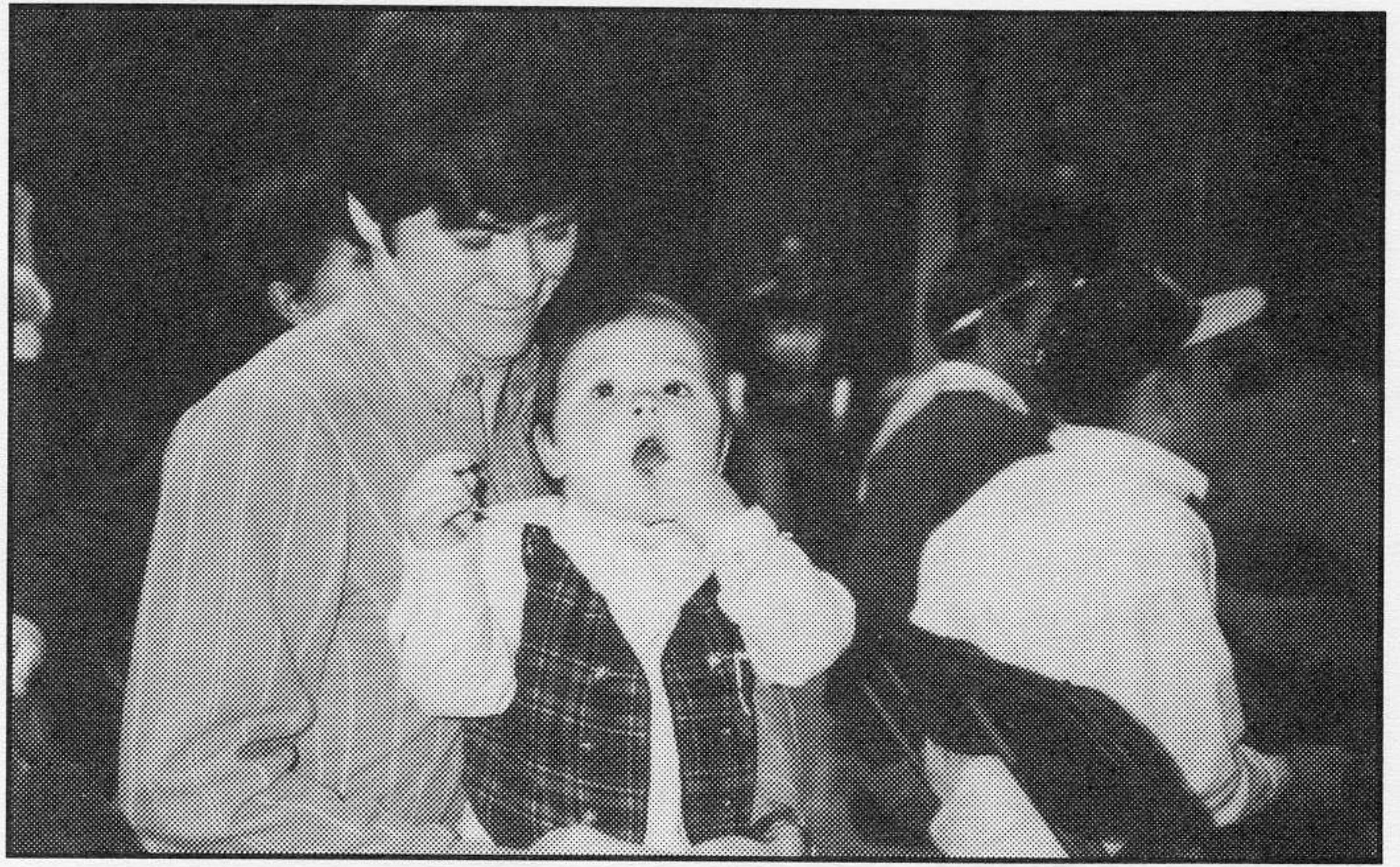


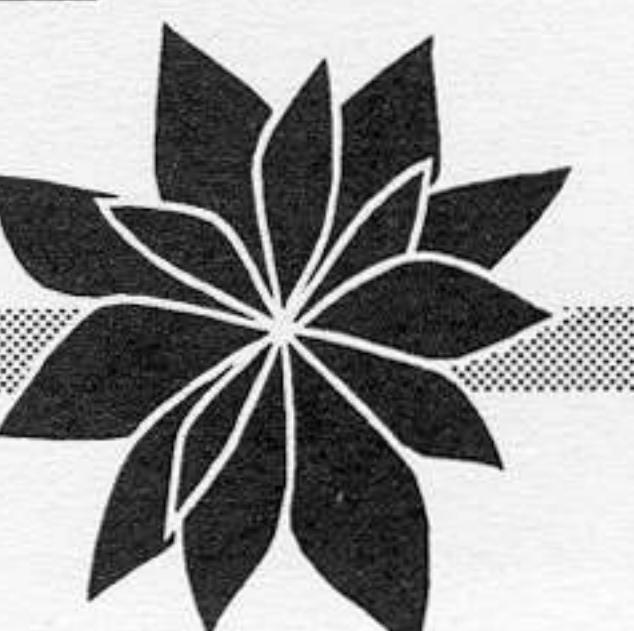
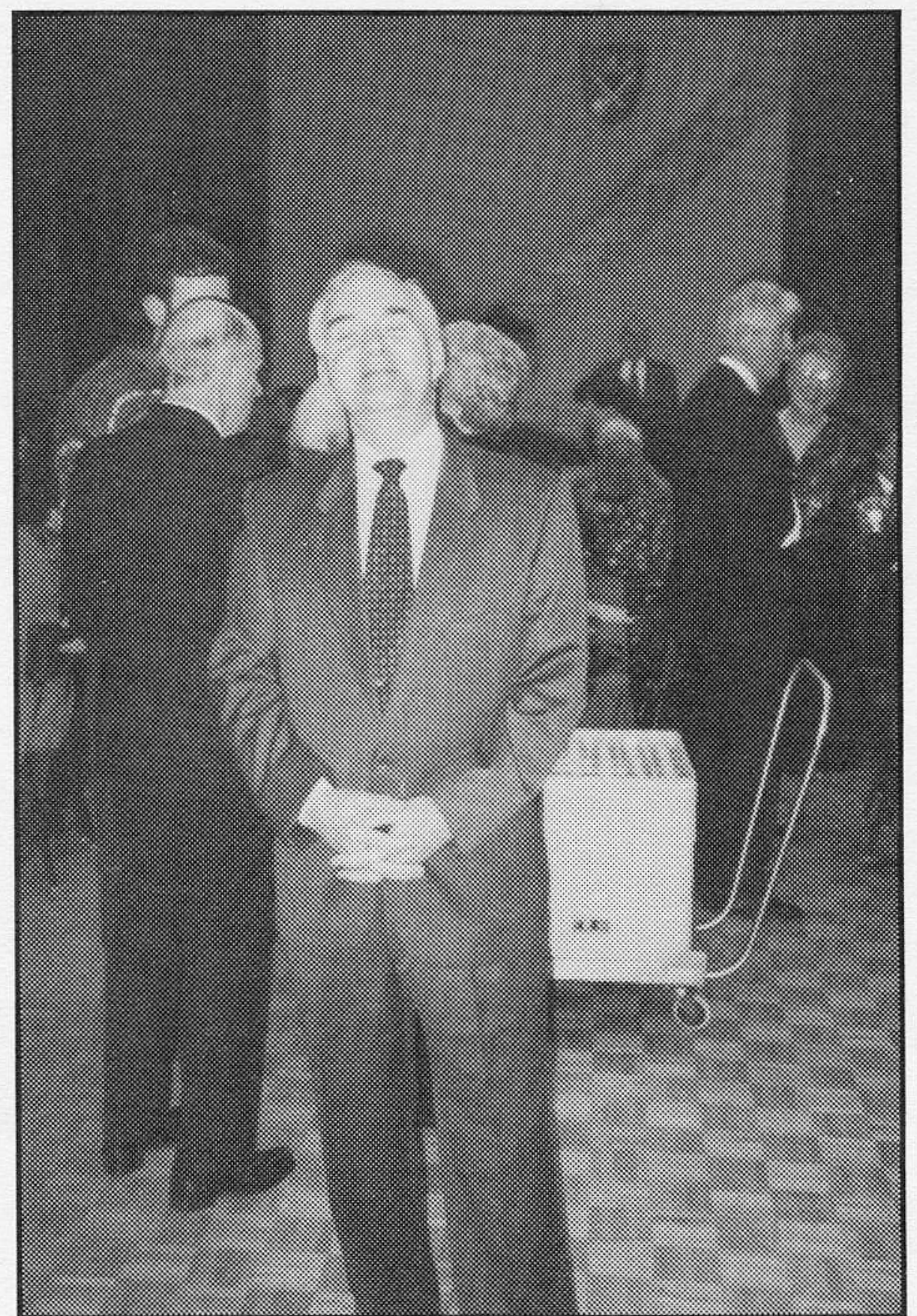
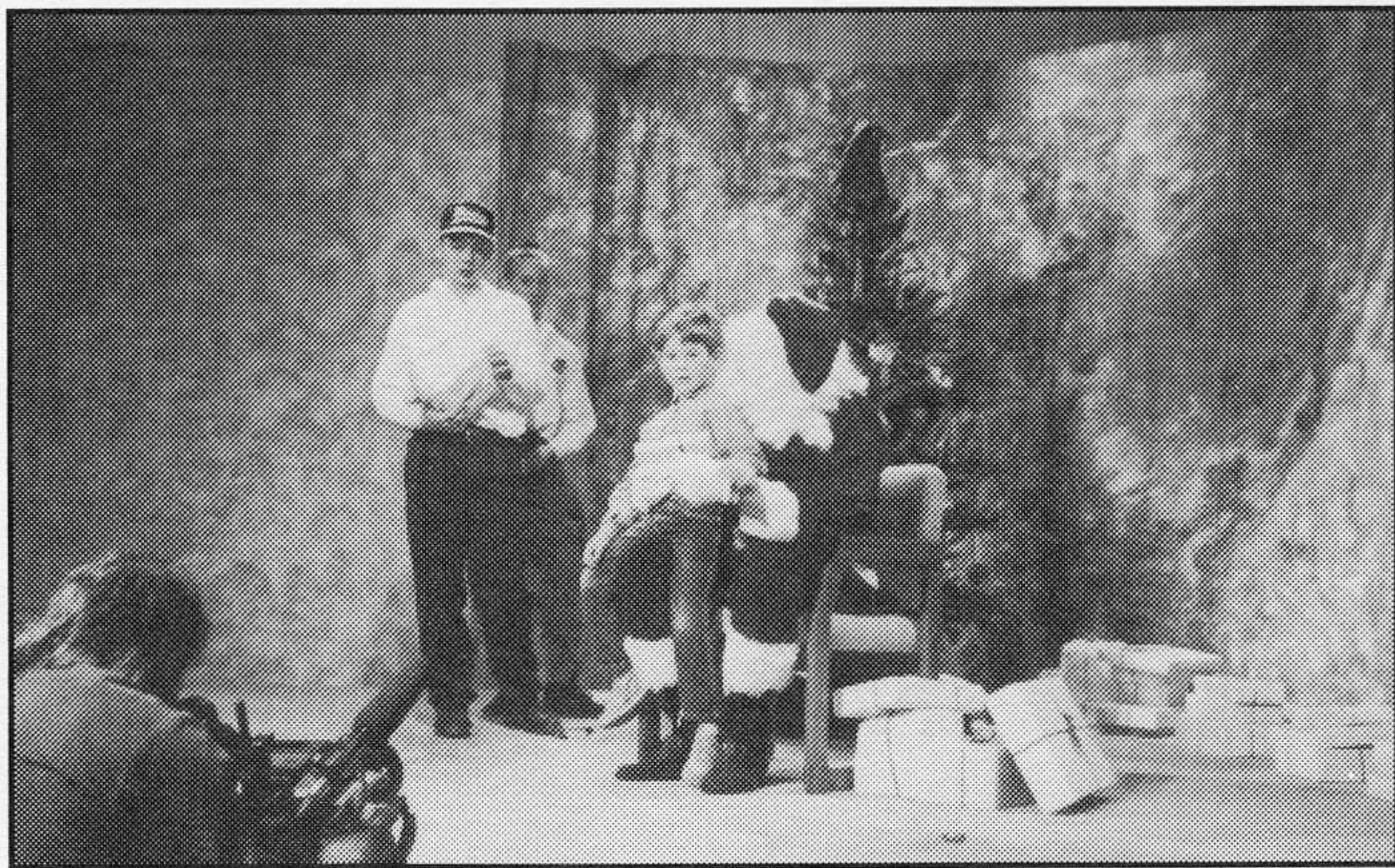
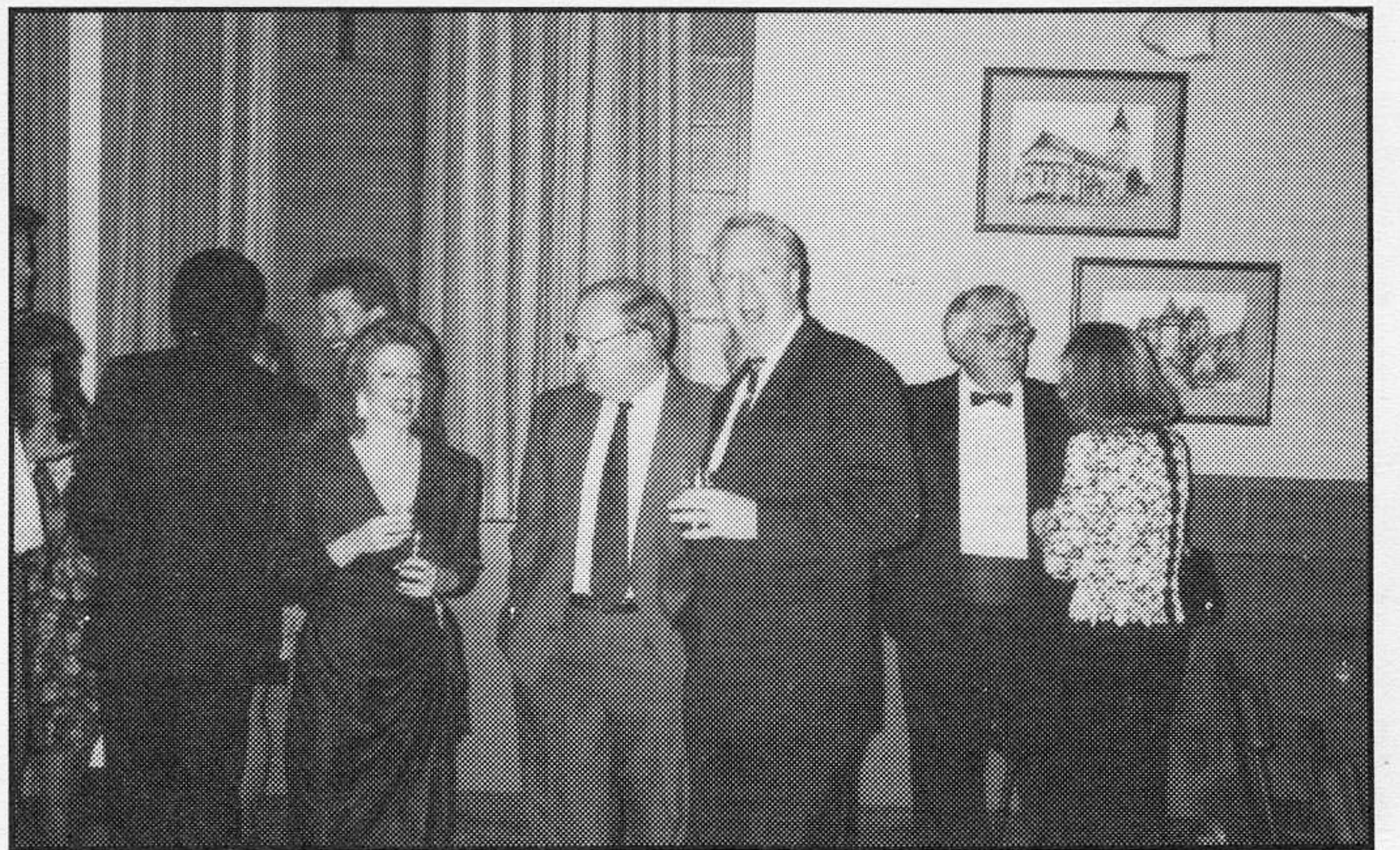
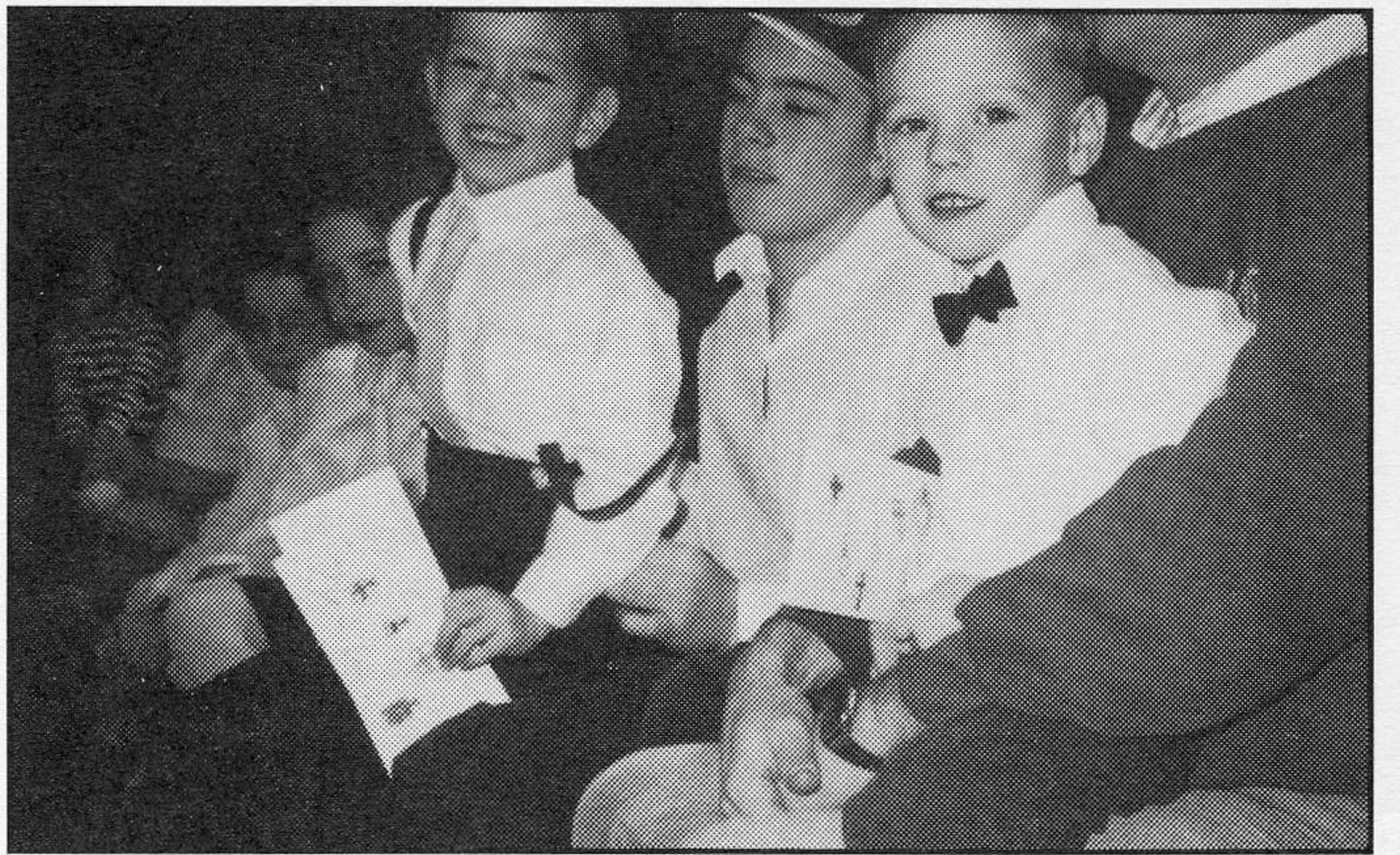
AGRICULTURE AWARENESS

In Remembrance - Elaine Cole

Elaine Cole, a household name in television in Kitchener-Waterloo for almost two decades until crippling rheumatoid arthritis forced her to retire, died Saturday, December 26, 1992 at St. Mary's Hospital. She was 80.

She was hostess of the 'Elaine Cole Show' on CKCO-TV and was the television station's director of women's interests from 1954 until the early 1970's.

Vice President & General Manager Don Willcox had the following comments; "Elaine was truly a remarkable person!! I had the good fortune to work with her during the height of her broadcast career and her "professional" approach to broadcasting certainly rubbed off on all of us and helped to make us all better broadcasters."

In January of 1992, she was feted by more than 400 in a tribute organized by the Mu Master chapter of the Beta Sigma Phi Sorority, of which she was an early sponsor.

Despite the pain of arthritis which "hit her like a ton of bricks in 1973", crippling her hands and destroying several vertebrae, Elaine remained cheerful and positive. "I'm just grateful that I can get around in my wheelchair with the help of Project Lift and my friends and family," she said in a January 1992 interview.

An inspiration to other arthritis sufferers, Elaine, who was named Kitchener-Waterloo Citizen of the Year in 1974, was a strong supporter of the Arthritis Society as a member of its board and a continuing financial sponsor.

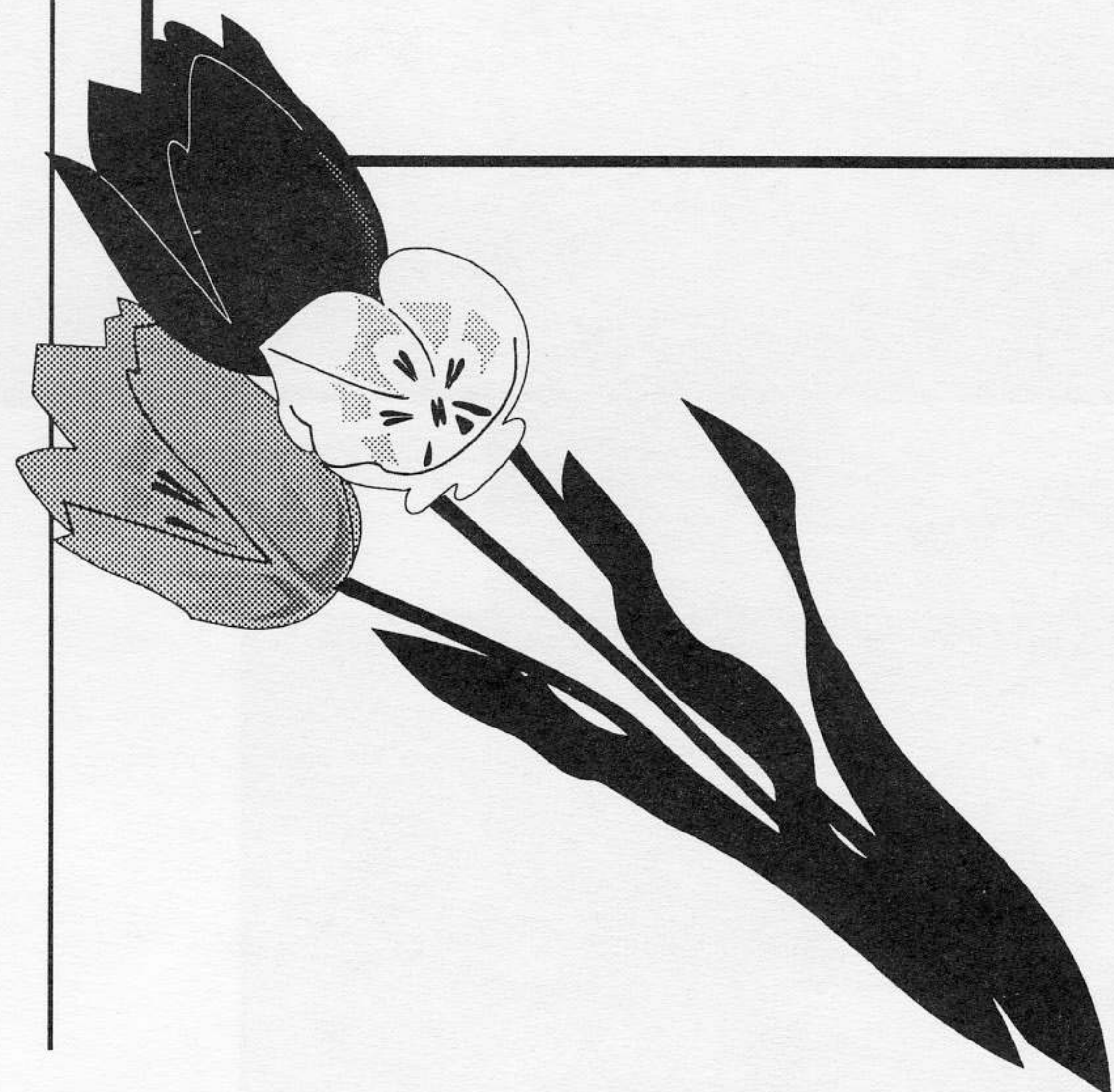
In Remembrance - Daniel (Dan) Sutherland

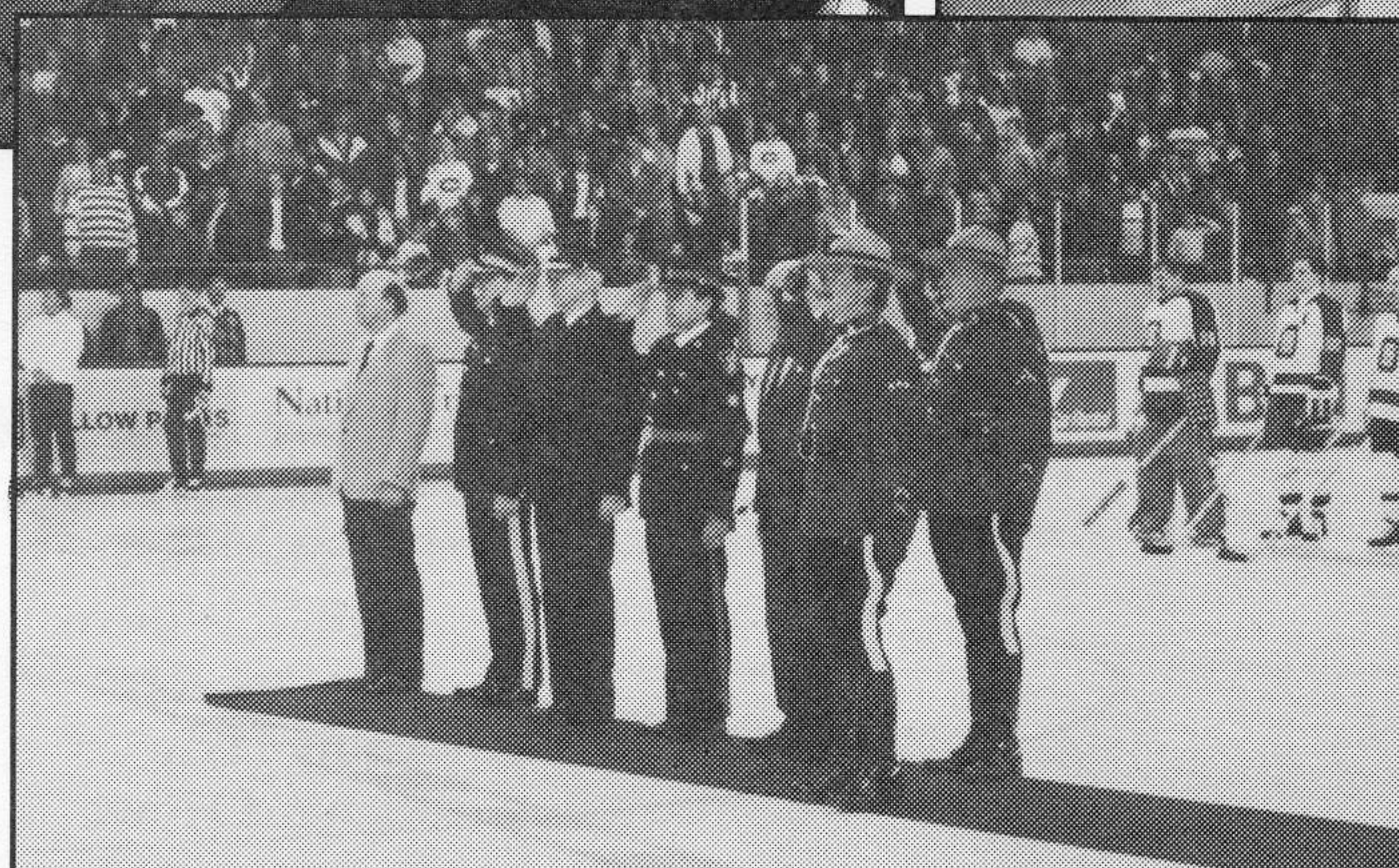
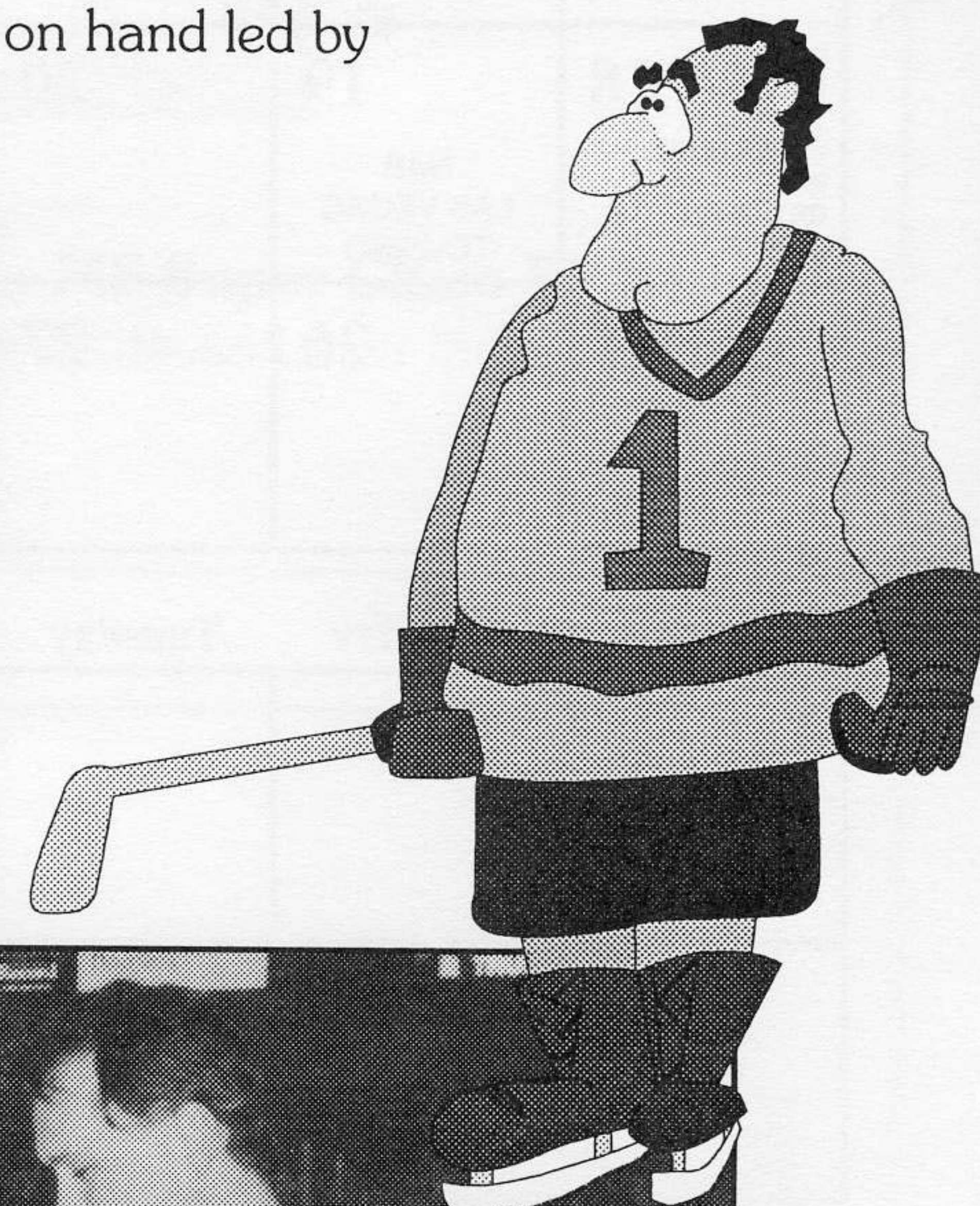
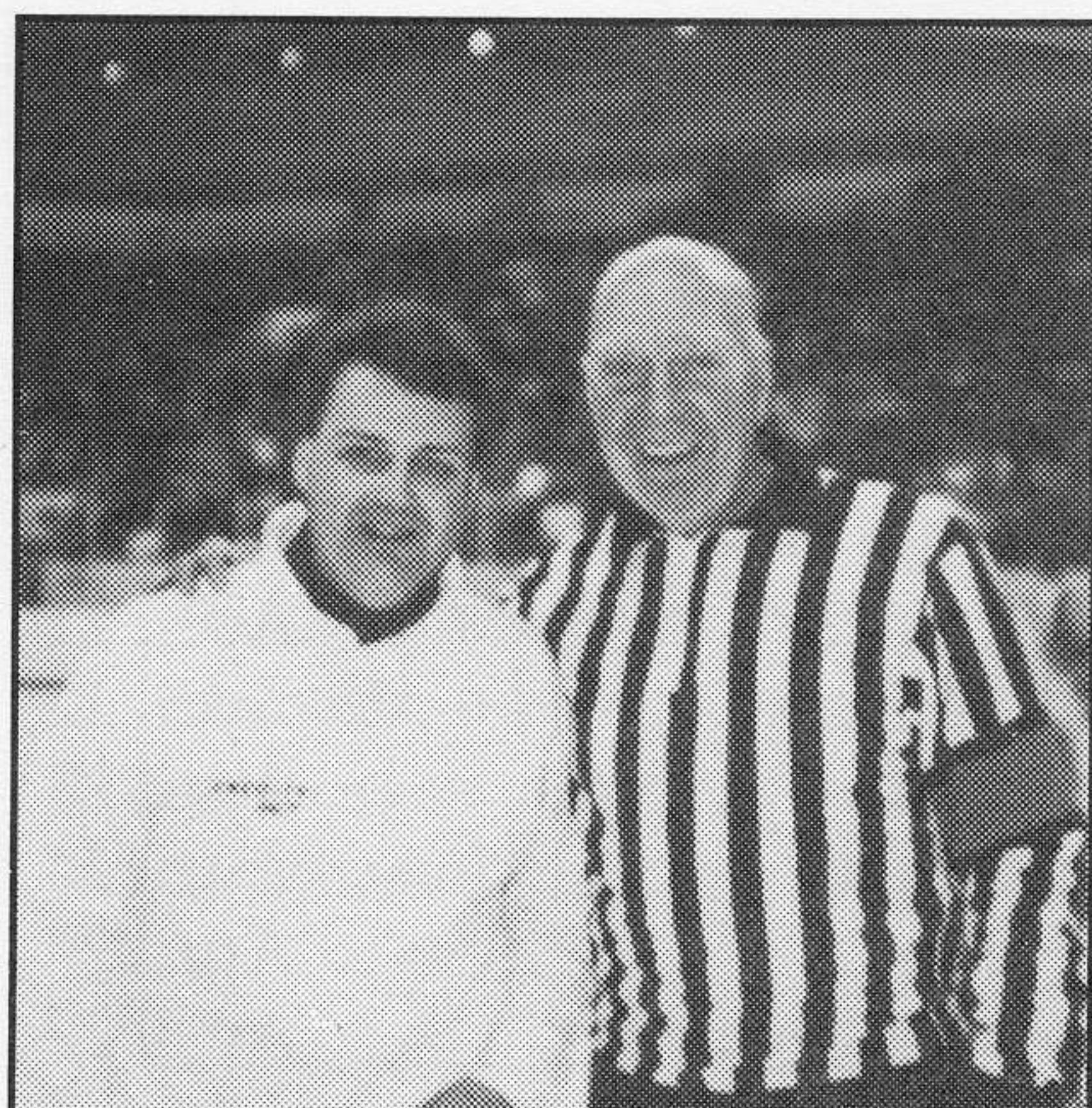
