EMPLOYMENT EQUITY

The following definitions have been taken from "Employment Equity" published by Employment and Immigration Canada.

Designated Groups or Target Groups were selected as the focus of Employment Equity because their labour market experience reveals long-standing patterns of:

- high unemployment;
- lower than average pay rates;
- concentration in low status jobs

Aboriginal Peoples

Aboriginal peoples of Canada consist of individuals who identify themselves as Status Indians, Non-status Indians, Inuit, or Metis.

Disability

Physical disabilities can be visible or non-visible and can include any degree of paralysis, amputation, lack of physical coordination, blindness or visual impairment, deafness or hearing impairment, muteness or speech impairment, or physical reliance on a guide dog, wheelchair or other appliances or devices.

Learning, mental or psychiatric disabilities can include learning or comprehension incapacities which are significant and persistent but permit the individual so disabled to carry out duties and perform tasks in a reliable manner under a reasonable amount of supervision.

Visible Minority

Persons who are non-Caucasian in race or nonwhite in colour (Employment Equity Act, 1986)







Operations has a very busy schedule coming up with several remotes, the new News, and Bob McLean's show starting up just about all at the same time. So if we seem a little busy. . . we are.



This is the last issue of CAPsule in which I will be involved and ANN GEBHART will be putting out this pay day page from now on. Please give her all the support you can.


