

- 1. Promptly obtain first aid
- 2. Notify the employer of any injury.
- 3. Notify the employer of the possible onset of a work related disease or condition.
- 4. Choose your own doctor or qualified practitioner. Once you have chosen, you may not change doctors without the Workers' Compensation Board's (WCB) permission.
- 5. Complete and return all WCB forms promptly.

Here it is the last week of the Summer, the Engineering Department has been very busy installing a new Production Control Room.. This past week saw the control room being put through it's paces as CKCO Action News started rehearsal's. On September 5 the new Control Room will go ON LINE, the first show being the Noon News.

The new production room is a State of the Art Facility incorporating the latest in technology. The new 32 input Ross Switcher and Ampex ADO will allow our new Promotion and News Graphics packages to be used to the fullest extent. Tied in also to the system is a Chyron Infinit! character generator, providing the utmost in flexibility and quality graphics. Communication is an important part also in the installation. A new Clear Com intercom system will give us access to all Production and Technical areas with ease and flexibility that can be modified in instant. This will take the communication nightmare out of special event coverage and make our next election easier. On the audio side a Studer Revox 36 input console will bring CKCO officially into the 90's with Full Stereo production capabilities and digital performance. There are several special features that will make live events go smoother with extensive patching and a Mix Minus that can be used with the RF Truck. and other live event use.

Early July saw our RF
Truck known as CKCOM1
make its debut. Final additions
were made in August including
a Camplex unit for ease of set
up and operation by a single
technical body. Numerous live
hits have already been done and
all of the trucks capabilities
have been tested. Ask Jim


NEWS FROM ELECTROHOME

The Electrohome/Baton Deal. Nothing new to-date on the big deal. I will keep you up-to-date as this progresses.


The United Way

EMPLOYEE OF THE MONTH


The Employee of the Month for August as determined by the Vision Committee is none other than Reg Seller.



WHAT BUGS CALLERS??

A recent survey asked 564 business people what bothers them most about the way a business phone is answered. Forty-two percent of respondents cited automated phone menus; 25% are annoyed when a phone isn't answered by the third or fourth ring; and 21% are bothered by busy toll-free numbers.

When asked to identify the most annoying employee phone habit, 34% mentioned using the hold button without asking the caller for permission to do so.

Being uninformed about the subject of the caller's inquiry - 30%.
Using poor grammar - 15%


