

To date there have been no new developments that I am aware of in the Baton/Electrohome negotiations. I assume this will take a little time.


Our United Way campaign is now well underway and we are at just under half of


One of the first residents at Norman Jewison's Canadian Film Centre, Medina is developing her first movie.






Do give some thought to making a contribution to the United Way. As Bruce says "are you willing to give up three coffees or three beers a week". Not a great sacrifice.






The rate of interest for 1996 CSB's has been set at 5.25%.


