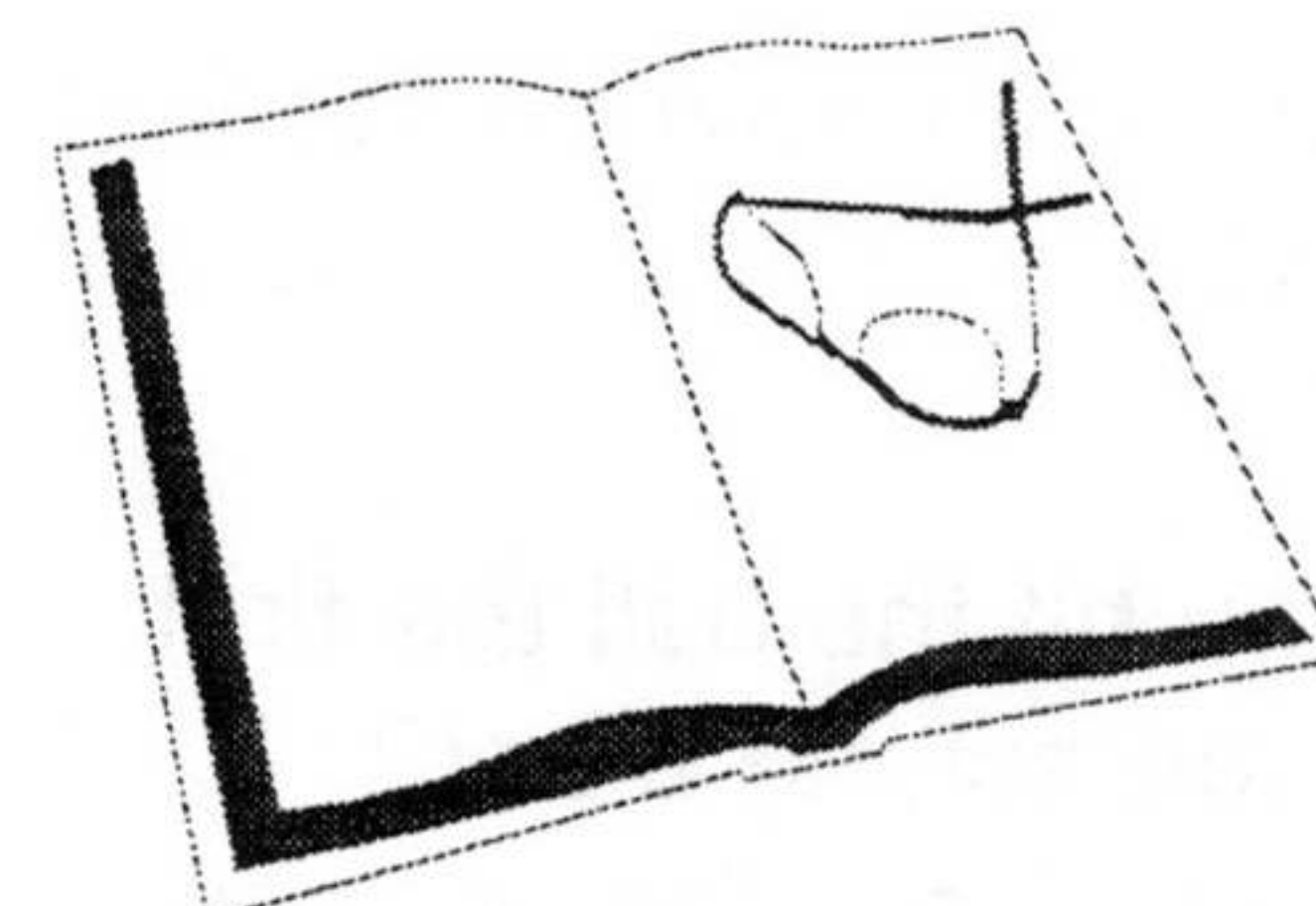

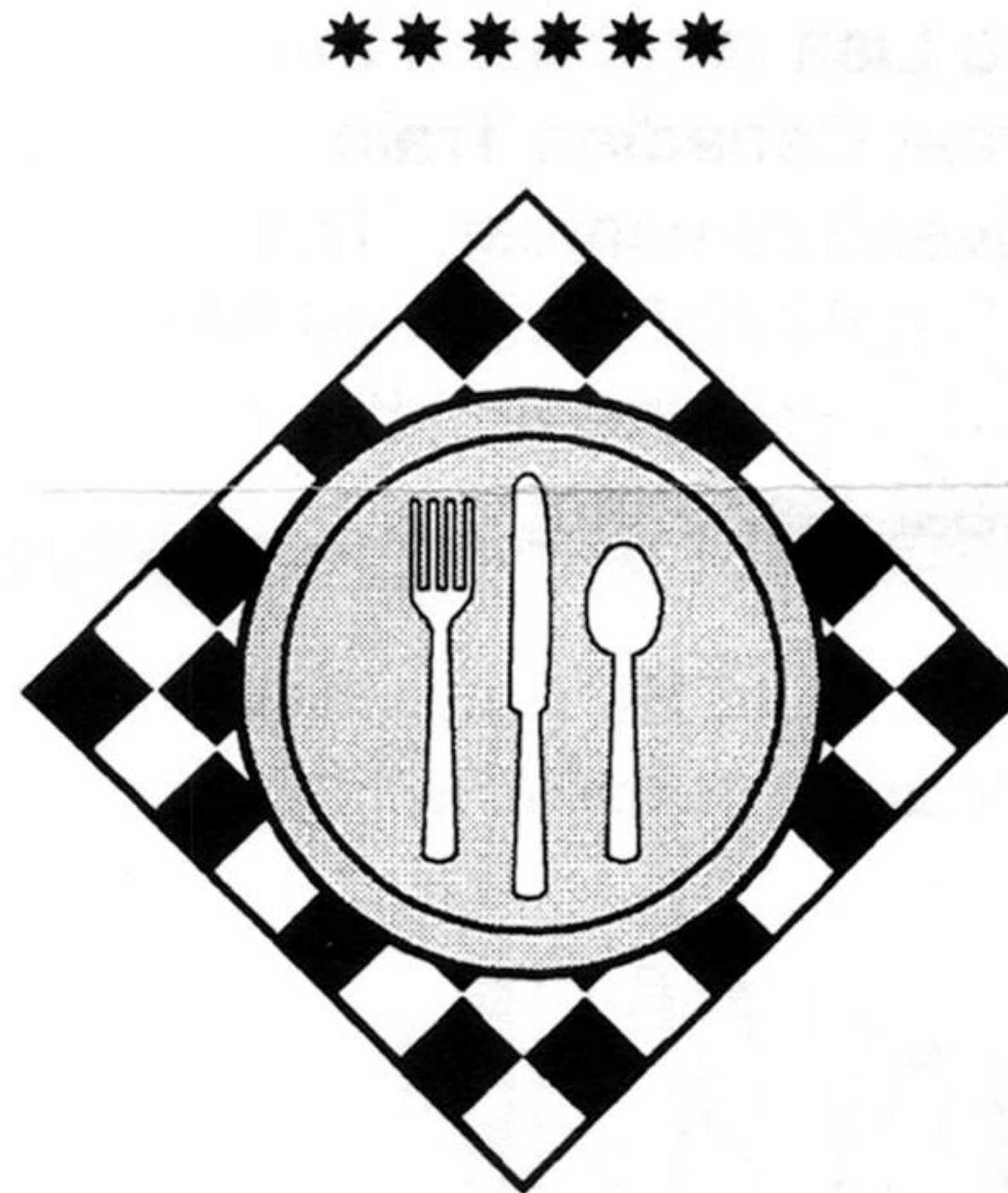


MARCH BIRTHDAYS

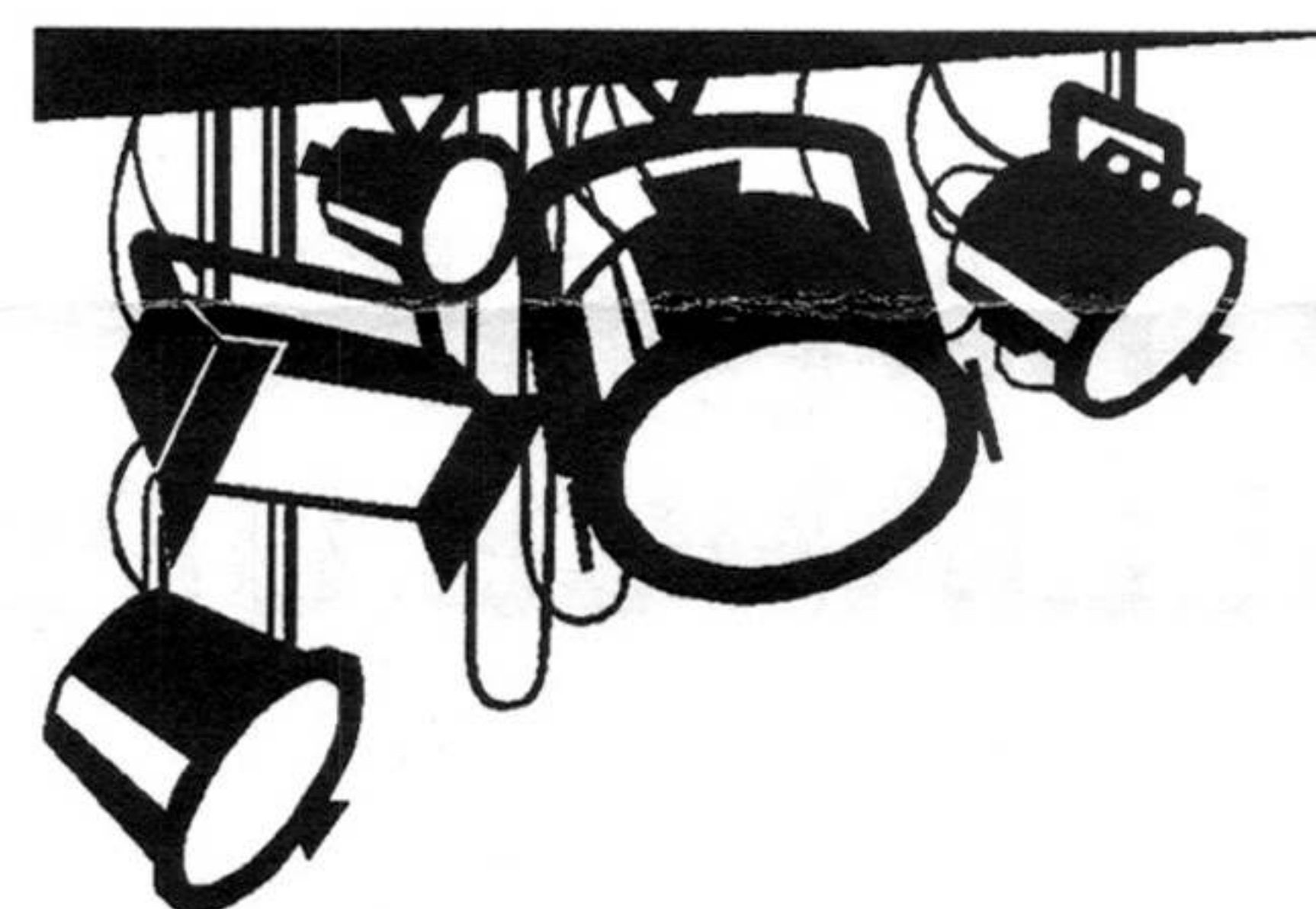

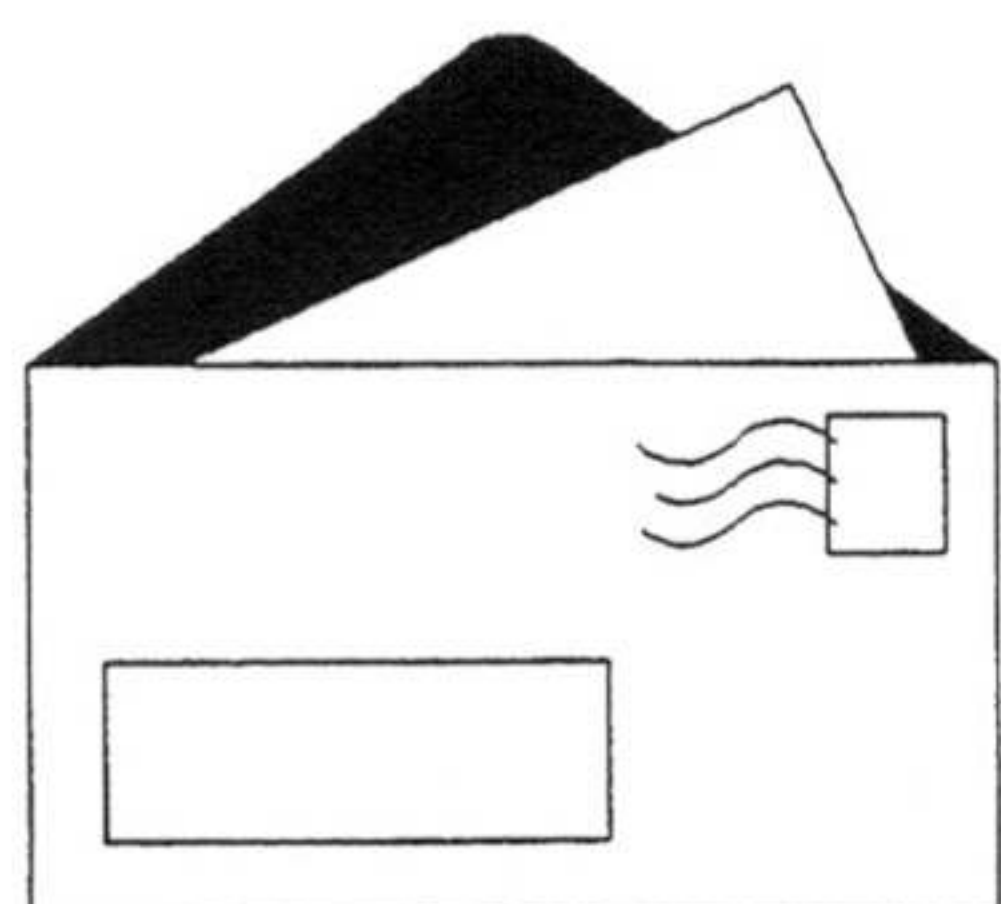

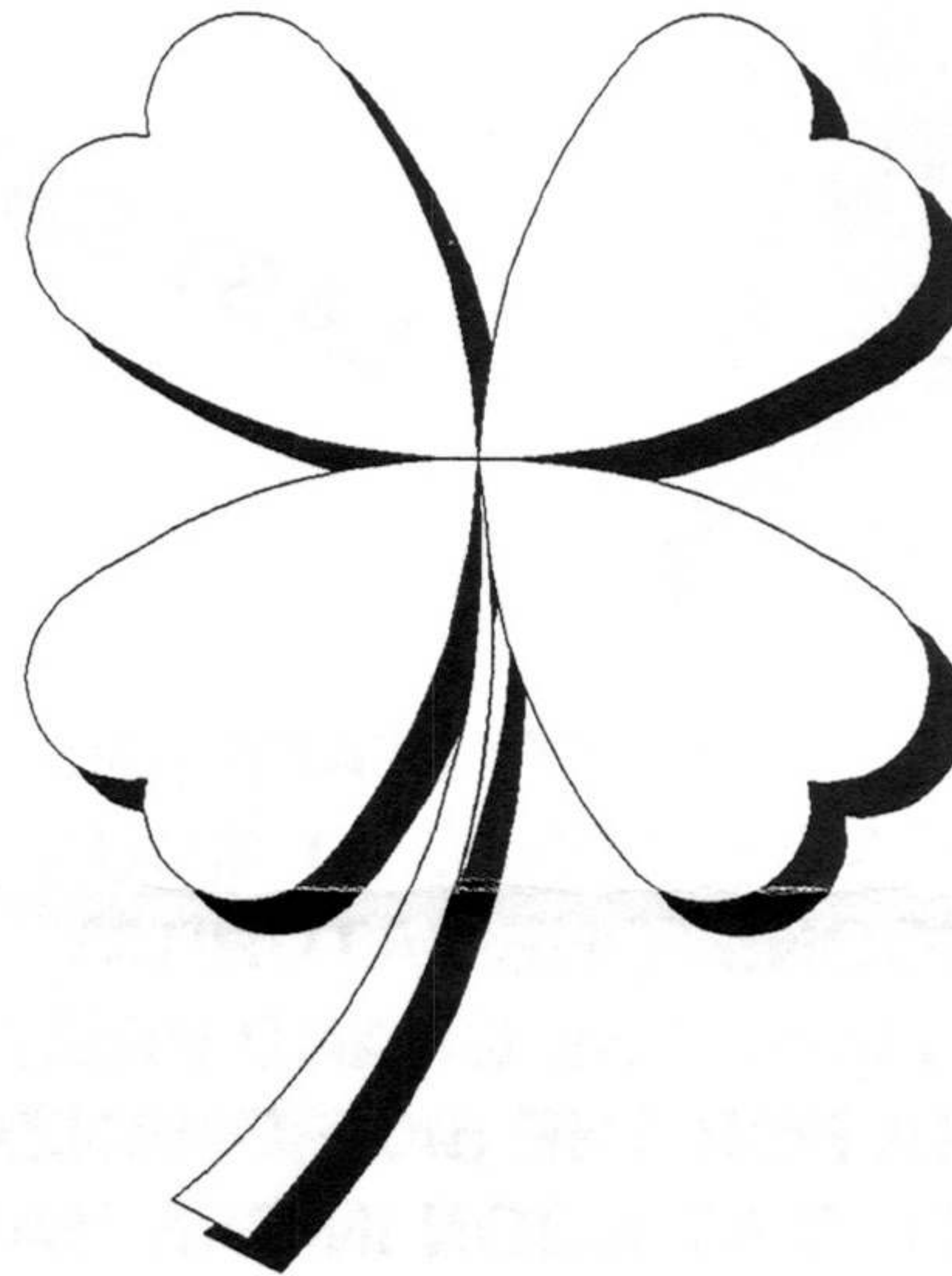
