Nightline didn't open quite that way, but a few weeks ago CKCO was the studio ABC used for one of the 'links' in the show. They did a story about foreign aid and one of the main proponents from "Doctors Without Borders" was in our Studio 2 talking with Chris Wallace in New York. How the signal got to ABC was a series of hops. First we sent a feed from Studio 2 down our ever useful (How did we manage without it!) CTV microwave link to CTV. CTV then routed it to Dome Productions. Dome then fed it to a satellite so that ABC could pick it up. ABC kept in contact with the guest using the normal phone lines. It was taped at about 6:30 pm for inclusion in that night's "Nightline". I have a copy of the section of the show that the interview appears in if anyone wants to take a peek.

Digital is everywhere, even on the air. So there! Our CTV feeds are now digital. What this means is that CTV now uses only one transponder (or channel) on a satellite to send all three CTV feeds (Red, Green and Blue). This Digital Video Compression system is the wave of the future in broadcasting technology. Sometime soon you will be seeing it used to deliver the cable-tv to your home.


Looking for a little information on some of our new programming for fall?




This year's on air 'BARB' campaign includes the opportunity to win a Yamaha outboard motor boat and accessory package, worth over \$7,000.




