



MODUS OPERANDI

What that means is we take readings to ensure that the location we pick enables us to get a good signal back to the station. This is then stored in the computer that controls the stations' microwave dish so that it's almost a one button setup. This way, for instance, the producer says the live-eye truck is going to Karen Redman's headquarters, then we just punch in the preset number for that location.






