General Vision Meeting

John thanked Ute for her past participation and recognized all of the current and past members.

John mentioned Lisa Lackenbauer's suggestion regarding the 1998 Oktoberfest and that CKCO and Translyvania Club may try and put something together for a CKCO night next year.

Traffic layoffs - A question posed to Dennis - There has been a meeting with the Traffic Department about this possibility and had a good discussion. He has heard nothing further at this point in time.

Employee reviews - Follow through - Will it continue? Dennis, as management, would like to see it continue. At the moment Baton is looking to consolidate a process that will be the same across all of the Baton stations. Ours for the moment does seem to be too long and management knows that it needs to be streamlined. There is definitely still the need for open communication.

Shifts - Randy was asked to explain how the shift rotation works in Operations. There was agreement that the timing of rotations is sometimes very difficult and something that can not always be controlled. It was suggested that the part-timers work the weekends or the odd times and shifts. This would be ideal, but there is not always enough personpower to do that. The Crew Chiefs are always involved in the shift decision making.

At this time, news shifts seem to be running all right.

Dennis was asked about Merit Increases- At this point in time there are no proposals to have merit increases. The contract has just been finalized. Dennis did point out that the door is not closed and that if someone has gone over and above consistently it is something that could be looked at.

Employee recognition - Doesn't necessarily have to be work related - Many employees have interests outside of CKCO in the community and through them CKCO has some acknowledgment. Employee of the Month - Is it valid? - Perhaps it doesn't need to be once a month - or perhaps there could be 2 in one month based on performance. Andrew Heubner, as

Chair of the Employee of the Month committee will bring up a motion to revamp the structure and criteria of the Employee of the Month.

The question was asked if Baton had a *Grand Plan*. Dennis responded in that since 1995 the plan has been to obtain control of CTV - That has now been accomplished. The stock market has had very positive response to this.

Can we forge our own identity? Does Baton control everything? Baton are our corporate owners and will want to take advantage of all that their combined assets can offer, but they see our local identity as a strength and have encouraged us to continue to build on it.

Supervisors must let Human Resources know about births, deaths, etc. within their group.

Vision - What should we be doing? - Further communication.

There needs to be a better relationship between Baton and CKCO - Dennis pointed out that it needs to be a corporate culture change and that it will be a while in happening.

Suggestion Box - Not being used, but all wanted to keep it in place.

It was suggested that we should have these general meetings perhaps twice a year - Most seemed to be in agreement.

Our goal should be to keep open the lines of communication - Let Janet Taylor or Dave MacNeil know if something in your department is going on. Maybe we should have an editorial section in Station Break so that people can vent productively.
