

Don't forget to cash in your BINGO cards and Poker hands for additional gaming chips before Friday December 3<sup>rd</sup>.





#### REPORTING WORKPLACE ACCIDENTS

If you are injured while working either on the premises or outside of the station it is imperative that you report the incident to your immediate manager and Human Resources as soon as possible. Report it regardless of whether the injury is minor or serious enough to result in time off work.

#### WHY IT IS IMPORTANT TO REPORT AN ACCIDENT

**PREVENTION** – If the company is aware then it can take the proper steps to prevent it from happening in the future. (ie. removing obstacles, training, ergonomics)


MINOR CAN BECOME MAJOR - Even if you perceive the injury to be minor at the time of the accident, there is always a possibility that it might impact you in the future. By reporting it, Human Resources will record the occurrence and if there should be further complications resulting in sick leave (Short or Long term) then the details necessary with respect to the accident are documented. The company must investigate and report all injuries resulting in time off work to Labour Canada.

**DISABALING INJURY** - In the event that a work place injury results in a long-term disability, the initial accident report is a critical component in establishing a LTD claim through our insurance carrier. For those employees who are unaware, we are no longer covered by WSIB (formerly WCB) insurance in the event of workplace accidents. Effective January 1, 1999, we replaced WSIB insurance with the same type of coverage for workers compensation provided by our existing insurance carriers.

#### PROCESS FOR REPORTING-IT'S EASY!

If you have injured yourself at work tell your manager the details and also report it to Human Resources. The incident will be documented immediately, the reporting process is brief and you will have the opportunity to review the report to ensure the details are accurate.
