




CKCO INFORMATION EXCHANGE

This may not have anything to do with sales, and then again it might, but whatever it is, it's timely.

My mother and father are 87 and 88 years old respectively, and although they have had some physical set-backs, they just keep going. Last summer, my dad had a "silent" heart attack. Complicated by the fact that he has only one lung, he developed pneumonia. Needless to say, he spent a good part of the summer in hospital. With the cut-backs in health-care, he needed 24 hour monitoring for a number of weeks. I have three sisters, all married, and all of us spent parts of the summer doing shifts at father's bedside.

During one of my stays, and after he seemed to stabalize, we became concerned about my mother's ability to care for him, should he come home. They live in a two story house and because my mother had destroyed her knee in a fall two years ago, we made some changes. Eventually, they would move downstairs, with a completely new bathroom, that my mother never uses. She continues to go to the basement to use the shower my father installed himself in the 50's.

The phone was another problem. It was the original and only phone they had; it was a black wall-mounted phone with a huge black ringer on the baseboard and a cord that led up the wall to the phone. The phone itself was a small rectangular box with the rotary dial sitting on top like a crown and the hand-set hooked on the side. The unit probably weighs 10 pounds. We thought it was time for a change and that a cordless would be perfect. We made the decision, with mother's approval and called Bell to make arrangements to install a new phone. During our conversation, I told the service representative that I wanted to keep the phone because it was so unique. I was told that would be \$49.00 with tax to buy the phone. Yes, they had been renting the phone for 50 years and never thought or been told, they could own it.

Although it is the most expensive phone in history, they never had to put up with the "Telephone Solicitation" phenomenon, but all that has changed with the new phone, which they took back because it had too many gadgets. Secretly, I don't think my mother trusted a phone without a cord.

Although the Executive would prefer to be able to keep functions open to all that wish to attend, we have found it difficult to do so for various reasons.


The Rec Club Executive is dealing with increased costs and a decreased budget. We have found that limiting the number of attendees enables us to offer a better variety of events.


The first race begins at 7:20pm!
