Both awards site CKCO's responsive, yet respectful, coverage of the Luft family tragedy.

CKCO's entire news team worked exceptionally hard to cover a disturbing event in our community – the worst cases of domestic violence in Canadian history. CKCO's coverage was timely yet sensitive. The Town Hall broadcast brought closure to a shocked community and emphasized solutions to family violence issues. Even a member of the Luft family participated...urging people to get help before a family conflict turns to violence.

The Town Hall broadcast was produced by John Matlock and hosted by CKCO's Daiene Vernile. The outstanding work by camera crews and many others of the CKCO News Team made this a unique and sensitive production. CKCO's Aphrodite Salas and Frank Lynn were the primary CKCO reporters on the breaking news coverage. CKCO's Assignment Editor, Dave Carswell, coordinated the team coverage.

These awards continue the tradition of award winning journalism at CKCO, which includes an Edward R. Murrow RTNDA award in 1999, and a Charlie Edwards Award in 1998.


