





King Street Cooks! (favorite recipes of CKCO employees)

Lunar Rhubarb-Apple Cake

Alan Fraser has brought samples of this desert into the Station - some of you may have been fortunate enough to have tasted it!

Batter

1/2cup butter

11/2cups sugar

1 egg

1 tsp vanilla

2 cups flour

1tsp baking soda

1/2 tsp salt

1cup buttermilk (or milk with 1 tsp vinegar added)

2 cups chopped rhubarb and/or apple

- Cream butter & sugar until smooth.
- Beat in egg & vanilla
- Add remaining ingredients except rhubarb, alternately with buttermilk.
- Toss rhubarb / apple with 1 tbsp of flour and mix into batter.
- Spoon into a greased 9x13 pan

Topping

1/4 cup butter
2 tsp cinnamon
1 cup brown sugar

- Blend together all ingredients and sprinkle evenly over batter.
- Bake @ 350 for 45mins or until the cake has risen and browned.

The surface of the cake is supposed to resemble the surface of the moon. Serve with ice cream




